Nurse's Corner:

Welcome to a new school year! What a crazy time it has been this past month! Here are a few reminders as we begin our new school year: -If your child test positive for COVID-19 or has had a close contact to a COVID-19 case, please notify the school nurse. Nurse Weathers will provide instructions as to what you need to do and provide a date to return to school.

Please do not send your child to school if sick, if your child has any of the COVID-19 symptoms, and/or has a positive COVID-19 test.

-Check in with your child each morning for signs of illness. If your child has a temperature of 100.0 degrees or higher, they should not go to school. Make sure your child does not have a sore throat or other signs of illness, like a cough, diarrhea, severe headache, vomiting, or body aches.

-If your child has a health condition or needs special care during the school day such as medication, treatments, or monitoring, please inform Nurse Weathers.

-The permission for medication form is available online at the district's website and the school nurse's office. No medications can be administered without ALL the correct documents in place. Written permission is required from the parent and the doctor prescribing the medication. Please remember that all medication needs to be in its original packing and brought to the school, by a parent/guardian. I strongly encourage anyone that uses an inhaler or epinephrine pen to complete forms and have one kept in the nurse's office.
