In accordance with the Amite County School District Board of Trustees Policy JQH {Dropout Prevention}, the school board will comply with all applicable provisions of the Mississippi Code of 1972. The school district will make diligent efforts to reduce and eliminate dropouts in the district. The school district shall maintain accurate records documenting enrollment and attendance, including dropout rates, and shall provide an annual statistical report to the State Department of Education. - 1. Reducing the retention rates in grades kindergarten, first, and second.

  - Credit recovery/ACT options
    - 1) Boot Camp- 1 day Test Prep Session
    - 2) Virtual Live Prep Sessions- Minimum 20 hours
