## To support your child's return to school this fall, we suggest the following:

- Establish a nighttime routine with a set bedtime at least one week before the first day of school
- Plan and practice a morning routine that includes plenty of time to eat a healthy breakfast and provides enough time
  to get out the door on time
- Set a screen curfew for school nights; a "downtime" where there are no screens, preferably about one hour before bed
- Post a calendar with a countdown to the first day of school
- Create a daily school-year schedule for home that includes a set wake-up and bedtime

#### **New ELA Curriculum**

In addition to reducing class sizes, we are implementing a new English Language Arts curriculum districtwide this year, <u>SAVVAS myView Literacy</u> for grades K-5 and <u>SAVVAS MyPerspectives English Language Arts</u> for grades 6–12. This research- and standards-based curriculum will provide all students with a complete reading and writing curriculum. As part of the curriculum, all students will be provided with a workbook to use during lessons to support their learning. All students will also participate in small groups for reading every week. Finally, we will continue to utilize the Accelerated Reader (AR) program as a supplement to our reading curriculum in order to provide additional ways to support students' reading comprehension. AR will also help students set and meet individual reading goals for the Kindles for Books program.

## Wellness Wednesdays

At Hudson Park Elementary, we continually strive to find ways to support students' social and emotional learning. New this year is the implementation of Wellness Wednesdays. Every Wednesday, all students will participate in a 45-minute social/emotional lesson taught using the Random Acts of Kindness curriculum. ## **Swim Lessons**

The Briarcliff Pool on our campus has been reopened, which means Hudson Park students will have the opportunity to participate in swim lessons this year. Students will participate in swim lessons one to two days per week in place of PE for one semester (approximately 18 weeks) during the school year. The swim schedule for the year is as follows:

- First Semester (September to January): Grades 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5
- Second semester (January to June): PreK, Grades K, 6, and multi-age

#### **Attendance**

Under Oregon law, (ORS, Chapter 339), all students between the ages of 6 and 18, who have not completed grade 12, are required to attend school regularly unless otherwise exempted by law. All students, five years of age, who have been enrolled in a public school are required to attend regularly. Students' attendance will be monitored and letters will be sent to

families with excessive absences. Oregon state law requires that we withdraw students who miss ten consecutive days of school. If a student is absent for any reason for ten consecutive days, they will be withdrawn from school and will have to re-enroll when they return.

#### Staggered Start-PreK, K, 1st & 2nd

This year, we are implementing a staggered start schedule for all preschool, kindergarten, first and second grade students in order to meet state, grant, and district requirements for assessments and to support students in the transition to school. The staggered start will provide staff the opportunity to set each student up for success as they begin the 2022-2023 school year. Preschool and Kindergarten families will sign up for a one-hour appointment, while first and second grade families will choose one staggered start day. During the staggered start, assessments will be completed and students will be introduced to the classroom. The first day of school for all preschool students is Monday, September 12. First and second grade students begin school Tuesday, September 13. All kindergarten students begin school Monday, September 19. ## <u>Transportation</u>

Students will be picked up and dropped off at their home address on file with the school. For any permanent bus route changes, please contact the school office before the first day of school or as permanent changes arise. Please note, bus changes are not allowed at this time. The one exception is students may change buses for childcare purposes only. Reminder: PreK, K, & 1 students must have a responsible adult meeting them at the bus for drop-off.

If you will be transporting your child to and from school each day, please use the parent parking lot for drop-off and pick-up to keep the bus lanes clear during morning arrival and dismissal. Upon arriving at school, school staff will be present at the

main entrance to transition K-6 students into the building. The main entrance will be the place for families to say goodbye to their students. Students will go straight to their classrooms upon arrival, where breakfast will be offered in classrooms to all students free of charge. For pick-up, you will be required to **sign your child out each day** at the HPE covered area near the playground. Please be prepared to show personal identification (ID). To ensure the safety of all students, children may not be taken out of class lines at dismissal.

Preschool families transporting their students to school each day, will go directly to the classroom to sign-in/out their student each day.

## **Nutrition Services**

Breakfast will be provided to all students at no charge.

Lunch for K-5 will be \$3.25 and \$3.75 for grade 6. Families may qualify for reduced or free lunches based on income or if they receive SNAP Benefits.

To access the meal menus, <u>click here</u>. Please note, there will be two lunch choices daily for students in K-5. The blue choice will be listed first on the menu and the red choice will be listed second. For the sixth grade lunch menu, use the same link to the lunch menu, but click Rainier Jr./Sr. High, then click on Lunch 6-8. Please be aware that due to supply chain issues we may need to change menus with short notice.

School funding and grants are often dependent on our free and reduced lunch percentage, so please help the school by completing a free and reduced lunch application to see if you qualify.
