Show your child how to deal with failure in positive ways (Elementary)

Sooner or later, your child will experience failure. The way you react to that failure can help shape his character and school success.

- · Remind him that you love him unconditionally. Your love isn't tied to his performance in school.
- · Focus on the positives. Mistakes are actually opportunities for learning. Help your child think about what he can learn from these experiences.
- · Praise what you can. "Most of your answers were correct on this test. That's an improvement."
- · Be realistic. If you know he's doing his best and he still doesn't bring up a grade, don't let him think you are disappointed. Instead, focus on creating a plan for improvement.
- Move on. Don't dwell on the failure. When parents spend too much time talking about setbacks, children can have a harder time moving Encourage your child to take responsibility for on.
- · Don't argue with your child's teachers or coaches to try to get them to change a decision or a grade. Your child needs to learn to respect their decisions.
- · Don't take over. If your child earned a low grade on a writing assignment, talk about ways to improve, but don't offer to write the next

paper for him.

· Be a role model. Handle your own mistakes and failures in positive ways.

Successful students have specific traits in common (Junior High)

No two children are the same, but successful To help your child bounce back from setbacks: students do have some things in common. Among other things, these students are:

- · Curious. They want to know things. Curious students won't accept "just because" as an answer. To stoke your child's curiosity, expose her to new ideas and experiences.
- · Persistent. They set goals and work diligently to reach them. Successful students keep trying until they master tough assignments. Praise your child for putting in the long hours studying; don't focus solely on the resulting grade.
- · Organized. Even an academic star will struggle in school if she is not organized. Give your child the tools to help her organize her schoolwork and manage her time, such as calendars, sticky notes and file folders.
- · Resilient. Everyone fails sometimes, but successful students don't let failure derail them. her actions and create a plan for improvement.
- · Open-minded. They listen to the opinions of others and engage in constructive conversations with classmates—even when they disagree.
- · Supported. When students know the adults in their lives love them and believe in them, the sky is the limit!



PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN FALL 2024

Preschool: Preschool will run full days, Monday through Thursday. Children must be four years old by August 1, 2024. Cost of Preschool is \$200 monthly. Tuition is due the beginning of each month.

Kindergarten: Do you have a learner who will turn 5 before August 1, 2024? If so, he or she is eligible to start Kindergarten in the fall. Parents whose students are currently enrolled in GPS Preschool Program do not need to complete the kindergarten enrollment process.

You will need a copy of state-certified birth certificate and a copy of the certificate of immunizations records when you come to enroll your child. To schedule an appointment to enroll your child for Preschool or Kindergarten, please contact the school after April 30 at 701-362-7426.

all voting yes; motion carried.


H.) Superintendent Evaluation Form – Hansen asked that the board members return the evaluation on or before March 1.
