Athletics


Basketball and Nordic are in full swing. The game/race schedules are on our website, or you can contact the school with any questions. We hope to see you at a home game soon!

I am excited to share a new opportunity that MCS is proud to offer to students and families. MCS has been approved to be an Online Knowledge Test Application (OKTA) location for the DMV. This means students may now arrange a time with the School Counselor to take the online permit test here at MCS. This provides a means for students to test in a familiar environment with a familiar face. If students pass, they are given a ticket indicating they passed, where they may then make an appointment at the DMV to bring in their official documents and test ticket so they may be issued a Driver's Permit. What you need to know about the FAFSA:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• It is income based.• Both the student and the parent must complete the FAFSA• You must have an FSA ID prior to completing the FAFSA• Talk to colleges of interest about questions regarding the FAFSA and financial aid. They are available for help even if you do not attend their institution.
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	Apply for Scholarships	<p>Do you want free money to go to college? Apply to those scholarships! National Scholarships are open all year, a simple Google search will direct you to scholarship sites. Local scholarships typically come out in the spring. Your counselor will send you scholarships as they become available.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• It is your responsibility to complete scholarships.• Be mindful of deadlines, they are typically hard deadlines.• Your School Counselor will not chase you down to make sure you complete a scholarship. If you want it, you must be proactive.• Scholarship information will be available to students in the Scholarship folder outside the Counselor's office. Seek this resource for additional copies if needed.• If you need assistance in turning a scholarship in, the School Counselor is happy to assist but you must make sure you complete the application and you are within the deadline.

*Students who are absent on a test day will miss the testing period for the exam and will have to sit for the exam during the next testing period which will be in June. Please be aware of graduating seniors as this may impact graduation status.
