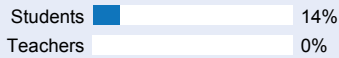

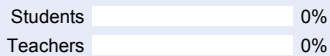

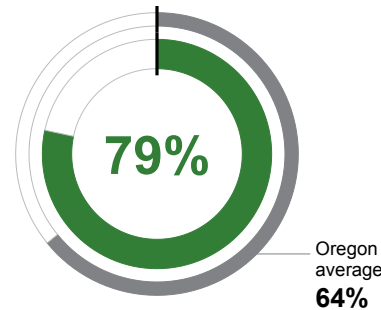

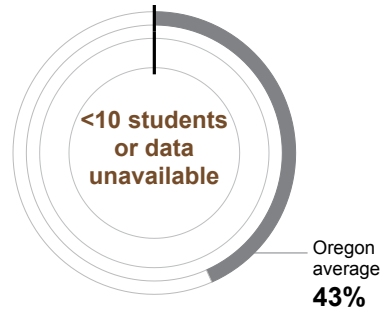

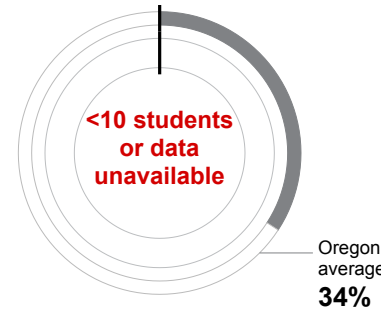
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Academic Progress

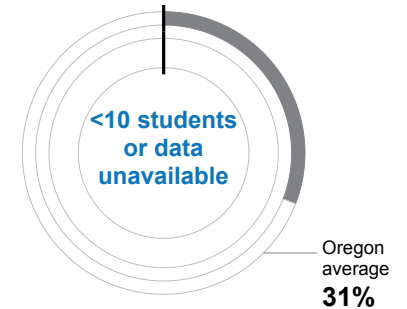
INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

State Goals
