  - Open door policy in school office.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
  - Parents are encouraged to communicate with teachers concerning progress and behavior.
  - Parents are encouraged to chaperone field trips.
- 6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.
  - Through daily folders, class newsletters, and school newsletters.
  - Through various technology platforms, including: Facebook, Instagram, School Website, Class Dojo, and RemindMe.
  - Through phone conferences, phone calls, and text messaging.
  - Through face-to-face conferences, including: scheduled report card pick up, home visits, and family/teacher/student conferences at various times of the day.
