Proposition 1 -
REPLACEMENT Educational
Programs and Operations Levy :

NOT A NEW TAX

Proposition 1 is not a new tax and if passed, would replace the expiring local levy at the same yearly amount of \$190,000 since 2009.

The expiring local levy averaged a tax rate of \$1.06 per \$1,000 of assessed property value during the last levy cycle. The new levy rate is lower at \$0.83 per \$1,000 of assessed value. This change is due to the increase in assessed property values.

Is there a senior tax exemption?

If you are a senior citizen or disabled person in need of property tax assistance, you may be able to take advantage of the property tax exemption program. To see if you qualify, call the Lewis County Assessor's Office at 360.740.1392 or visit their website at: www.lewiscountywa.gov.



What is the difference
between
a bond and a levy?

Bonds are for new construction and rebuilding of schools. Levies pay for the learning that takes place inside schools like teaching staff, nurses, utilities and extra curricular activities.



Bonds=Building



Levies=Learning

What will the levy funds support?

The passage of Proposition 1 would help Evaline School District educational programs and operations that are not fully funded by the State of Washington, which can include the following:

*non-high payments: Evaline does not have a middle or high school, therefore the district pays annual levy fees to neighboring districts where our 7th-12th grade students attend middle and high school.

* special education programs not funded through basic education

*music recitals and programs

*annual winter play as well as other school programs and activities

*curriculum replacement

*technology equipment and enhancements

*security and emergency preparedness

* field trips and field trip transportation

*regular transportation not fully funded by basic education

*student food services

*professional development for staff

* support services provided by ESD113

*infrastructure such as utilities, maintenance, operations and insurance outside of basic education funding.

You should receive your ballot soon.

In December we were excited to resume having our Winter Music Concert, Carolling and putting on the Winter Plays for our community and families.

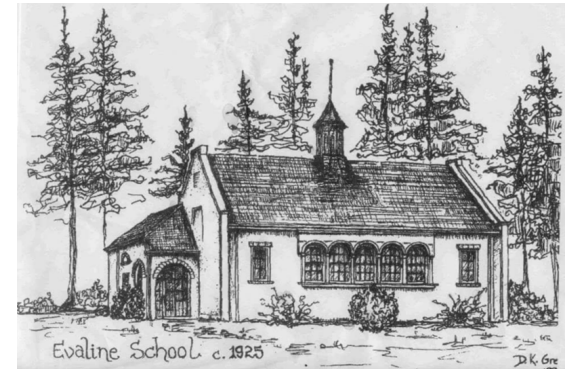
