Audience	Specifically targeted to 1st year teachers, this training is also applicable to all probationary teachers and/or teachers on an alternate path to certification.
Description	 Keeping students actively engaged in their own learning is an ongoing challenge for every teacher, but there are tools to help. Explicit Instruction is the focus of this session, and Building Thinking Classrooms is offered April 15, 2025. Student engagement strategies that elicit frequent responses – paired with a brisk pace – are integral to both instruction and formative assessment. At this session, participants will practice response strategies that engage all learners, including verbal, action, and written responses. Although the strategies apply to all grade levels, most examples will be from Grades 3-9. The research basis comes from recommendations for "Eliciting Responses" by Dr. Anita Archer and Dr. Charles Hughes in their book Explicit Instruction: Effective and Efficient Teaching (2011).
