# 10. NEW BUSINESS

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2 3 Α. **Roseanne Lombardo** spoke about the recent situation at Paulsboro High 4 School where a parent made their way to the classroom. She said she 5 attended the meeting and they will be making changes regarding people 6 entering and exiting the building. You will need to be escorted by the 7 school security guard to where you need to go. Teachers will now have 8 walkie-talkies in their classrooms if needed. The big question was why did 9 it take so long for the police to be notified? Apparently, they called the 10 kids in the classroom down to the office and the kids did offer the phone 11 video. So, it took time to process the video before calling the police. Mrs. 12 Lombardo doesn't know if it was really three hours because the news can 13 be inflated. They are looking at their entry/exit procedures; where it went 14 wrong and how to fix it. They are letting everyone know, staff and 15 students, that they cannot let just anyone in the building and 16 consequences will follow if they do not comply with this procedure. Mrs. 17 Lombardo also said these are high school kids who order through door dash for lunch so that presents a problem with letting people in the 18 19 building. Dr. Jen Foley said it can be hard to train your staff and students 20 not to open the doors because we also want them to be helpful. Mrs. 21 **Lombardo** said they are also working with a new Superintendent so there 22 are many changes going on. Erin Herzberg said she was glad to hear 23 they are looking into this problem. The Board thanked Mrs. Lombardo for 24 keeping them informed. 25
