4th Grade News



In Navajo, February means "baby eagles." February brings the hatching of young eagles.

Reading: We will begin lessons in learning about plant and animal adaptations through reading fable, nonfiction, and informational elements. We will apply the following comprehension strategies: predicting, cause and effect, language use: personification, summarizing, compare and contrast, language use: idioms, adages, and proverbs, making connections, main idea and details, language use: descriptive words, asking and answer questions, fact and opinion while reading the text.

Independent Reading: Ensure your child continues to read independently at home and utilize the Tumblebooks-www.tumblebookslibrary.com online. Have your child record the books he or she has read on a reading log sheet.

Math-We will continue lessons in using a variety of strategies to multiply and divide.

Practice Math Fluency: Ensure your child continues to practice and know the math facts in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. One of the best ways to have your child know the facts is to practice daily. You can use games, flashcards, versatiles, and online math games. (I have provided your child with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division flashcards to use).

Science-We will continue lessons in Energy.

Social Studies-We will begin lessons in Chapter 3 Government in the United States.

Navajo Language and Culture-We will continue lessons in basic Navajo words through visual, pronunciation, practice, and saying the words focusing on the four directions.


