




Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics


ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

School Goals

CES will provide a program to allow ALL students the opportunity to succeed academically, develop social-emotional skills, and pursue a life of wellness. CES will build multi-tiered systems in reading, math, social-emotional development, and attendance to meet this goal. We will improve math performance by developing an RTI system for math to ensure students receive quality instruction and necessary supports when needed. CES will develop systems and interventions to support students that are at risk due to chronic absenteeism. CES will build practices to develop the social-emotional skills needed to become resilient individuals.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

CES will continue to create a safe and welcoming community school environment by further developing our Positive Behavior Interventions & Support systems and practices. CES will establish a Culture of Care based on Trauma Informed School best practices. Furthermore. CES will build systems and practices to support all students' social-emotional development. 




