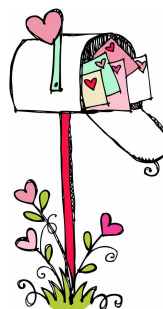

Keep reading aloud for 20 minutes every night!

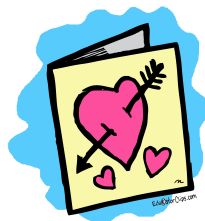


Third and Fourth Grade Classroom
