
C.C.H.S. 16 Kingston 9


C.C.H.S. 26 Chattanooga Central 5


C.C.H.S.27 East Ridge 18


C.C.H.S. 0 Rhea County 28


C.C.H.S. 24 Soddy Daisy 7


C.C.H.S. 20 McMinn County 7

Some clubs schedule trips. The Spanish Club went to St. Augustine, Florida last March, and the French Club is planning a trip to Canada this summer.






The annual Homecoming parade, which included many entries of floats, clowns, bands, and students, marched


SADIE HAWKINS 1979

































"I Sincerely Doubt That This Old House Is Very Haunted"

It was November, 1978. The Jets had just ended a year of unimaginable disappointment with an 0-10 record. The team was faced with severe criticism and many fans had lost faith in the coaching staff.

But the coaches and the oncoming 1979 team would not be discouraged. Each player had his own specific goals which he copied on paper. Contrary to the belief that the football team is idle during the non-season months, this group of athletes worked hard from November, 1978 until the final game 12 months later in 1979. Jets pumped iron and did agility exercises every day. Many after school hours were spent running, passing, and kicking.

Spring practice took place in March. Grueling tackling and blocking drills had become a way of life for the Jets. Along with the arrival of summer came the hot, humid, 95 degree days. While others were swimming or skiing, Jets were slaving under steel barbells during the "Power-explosion Program" and sweating on the track below the blistering sun. Pre-season practice rolled along on August 10, together with its suffocating wind-sprints. The dry, cracked lips of the Jets greedily absorbed the Gatoraide provided during the 5 minute break in the middle of practice. It was time for camp. Columbia Military Academy, a torture chamber the Jets will never forget, was the only football camp the Senior Jets had ever known. The team left C.M.A. with optimism; they were "Camp Champs."

After all the drudgery and sweat, the Jets were finally ready for their first game. C.C.H.S. left its Homecoming game undefeated, the number one team in the district, and receiving honorable mention in the state rankings. The team was defeated in its next game but came back to beat Cleveland two games later and clench its dream of long months past, a bowl bid. The Jets went on to achieve a record of 8-2 in regular play.

The biggest moment in the lives of many loyal Jets came on November 17:


THE 1979 TOBACCO BOWL


The Jet landed in a tobacco bowl on November 17. There in the bowl to meet the arrogant airplane stood a herd of roaming Rams from Madison, chewing chaws of that delicious leaf. The C.C.H.S. winged wonder took an early 6-0 lead in the first quarter, but the aeromatic aroma of those billy goats had an effect against the Jet. The rambling Rams went romping down the tobacco field to spit in the end zone. The jumbo Jet, then came back hunting lamb livers, and again gained the lead. By late in the fourth quarter, those tin can eaters achieved a 21-12 lead over the desperate demons in blue. The Jet got a grasp on that fickle football and flew it back to the goat goal line to make the score 21-19. With 1:39 left in the game, the Jet regained possession of that tobacco ball but no amount of spitting or chewing could carry that stubborn, inflated pigskin to the end zone of those unrelenting Rams.
