The continued study of South Carolina from Reconstruction to the present, including the struggle for social and economic justice waged by the people of South Carolina, further allows students to see the progress that the state has made and also to visualize the future changes yet to be met and overcome.

Grading Procedures and Late Assignment Policy:

A rubric detailing how any project or research paper will be graded will be provided. Quizzes will account for 35% of the student's overall grade. Classwork and Class Participation will combine to account for 25% of the student's overall grade.

A late assignment is any assignment that is not submitted in Google Classroom by 11:59pm on the assigned due date. It is the responsibility of the student to submit their assignment into Google Classroom by the assigned due date. Even in the absence of a student, it is the student's responsibility to get the assignment turned in on time. In the case of an excused absence (as defined by Dorchester District 4 and approved by Harleyville-Ridgeville Middle School), the assignment must be turned in at the beginning of class, into Google Classroom, the next day that the student returns to class. Any assignment that is turned in late into Google Classroom will receive the following point penalty:
