Blood Drive Successful Despite Weather

The morning of April 6 dawned cold and snowy, but that didn't stop the annual Red Cross Blood Drive sponsored by the student council. Though some of the students who were planning to give blood at the drive weren't able to get to school because of the weather, 29 students, teachers, and community members showed up to give.

Though donating makes her nervous, second time donor Danae Burdett explained why she gives: "I've heard so many times how important blood donation is, so I want to do my part, even though I don't love the process."

Student council members worked at the drive throughout the day, running the registration desk and chatting with donors. Student council secretary Tim Hofmann said, "The student council was honored once again to sponsor the blood drive. We feel, as Christians, that it is our duty to serve others. What better way to serve than by giving your blood to possibly save someone's life?"

Throughout the day, the Red Cross collected 21 units of blood. Though the total amount was smaller than hoped due to the weather, the day was still a success. Student council sponsor Becky Ritta said, "I'm so impressed with our student body and their desire to give back by donating blood. Our appointment slots filled up faster than they ever have before, and I'm sure that if the weather had been ideal, we would have had an amazing turnout."

Senior Athletes Sign with Colleges

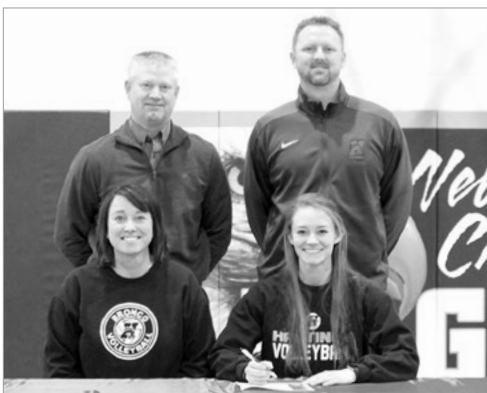

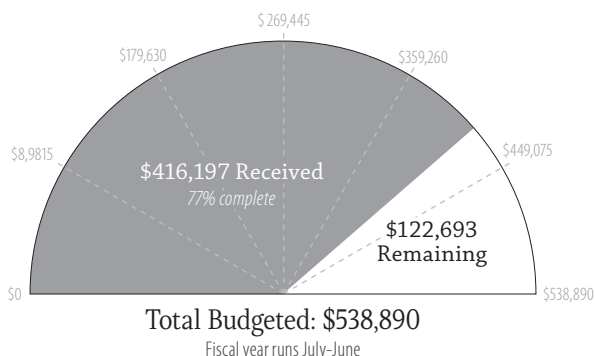

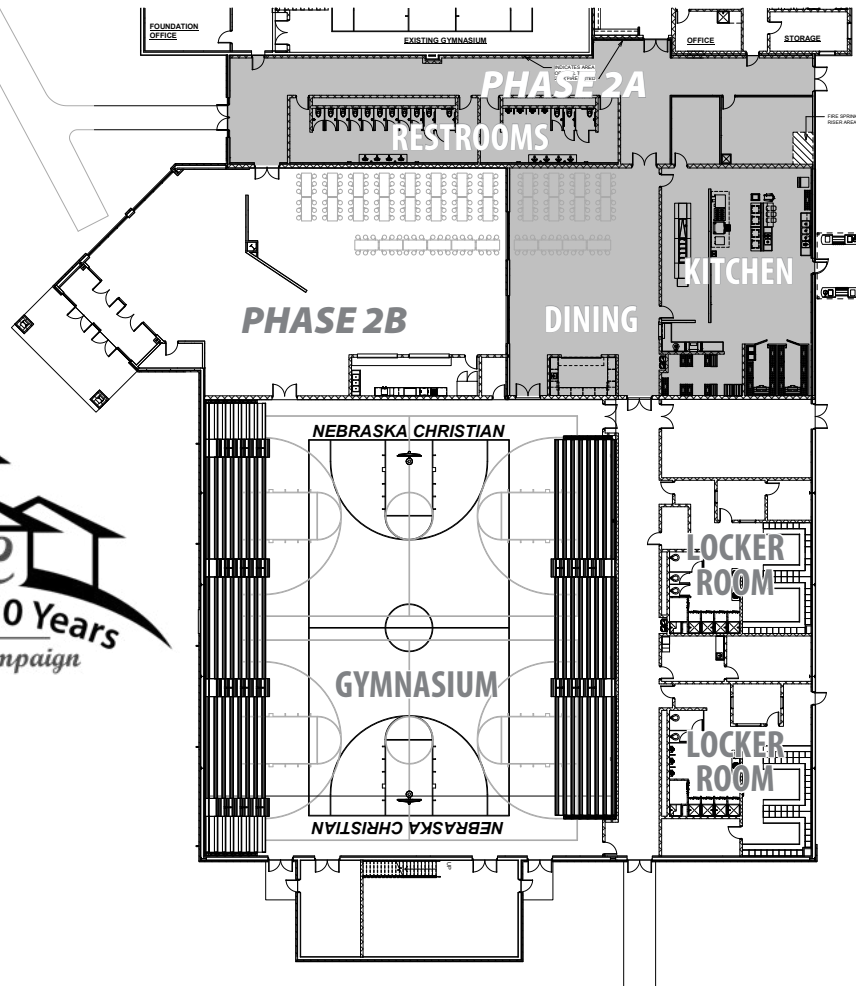

my church, with my friends, and with my job. In the end, they did offer, and I brought my family to Nebraska Christian. I believe that God moved us to Central City seven years ago, and we have benefitted and grown from our obedience to His call to work at NC.

As many of you already know, my family and I have decided to begin a new adventure. We will be moving back to the Hastings area in June, as I will become the superintendent at Silver Lake Schools. Although we are very excited about this next chapter in our lives, there are many people that we will be sad to leave and many great things about Nebraska Christian that we will miss.

The Lord has allowed many exciting things to happen in the past seven years under the leadership of dedicated board members and staff. Students have come to know Christ, and others have been more fully equipped with a Christian worldview. We have seen an increase in enrollment, we’ve added more staff and curriculum, and we have been able to update infrastructure, all while having a balanced budget and paying teachers on time. This hasn’t always been the case in the

history of the school, and I thank all of you who have been praying for us and have been helping to provide financially.

I feel that today NC isn’t in the survival mode that it had been in at times in the past, but that it is in “thrival” mode. I know that “thrival” isn’t a word, but I hope it conveys what we want for our students. We want all of them to reach their God-given potential, to be followers of Christ, and to impact their world. When I say “we,” I am talking about our Advisory Council, board, teachers, parents, coaches, and support staff. I also want to include all of you alumni, parents of alumni, friends, and supporters of Nebraska Christian in the category of “we.” This school is being used by God and is providing a great education to students and ministry to the world.

As I leave, I would ask that you continue to be in prayer for our school daily. I would also ask that you will prayerfully consider if the Lord would have you commit to walking with Nebraska Christian through monthly financial gifts. As you can see from Tom Dockweiler’s article on page 2, we are a ways from a balanced budget for this year.

My family and I have benefitted from being part of Nebraska Christian for the past seven years. I hope that you also see the benefit of having a Christian school that is preparing students with a Biblical worldview to be our future leaders in all aspects of society. We need more prepared, Christian leaders in our world.

We trust God for everything—including our financial situation. He uses people like all of us to fill this need. I would love to be able to leave Nebraska Christian knowing that the budget for this year, and for years to come, will be one in which “thrival” can occur, and not just survival.
