# Eucharistic Revival Information

# **REFLECTION** ~ Think about this ...

When we go up to receive him in Holy Communion, let us not be distracted by looking around, staring at other people, or walking carelessly. Regarding the manner of reception, we should consider how we can honor our Lord at the important moment of receiving Communion.

The Church in the United States allows for the reception of the Eucharist on the tongue or in the hand, "at the discretion of each communicant" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 160). Throughout the centuries, however, the Church considered that more reverence was shown to our Eucharistic Lord when received kneeling and on the tongue. Pope Paul VI allowed reception in the hand based on particular circumstances for certain countries, but he was worried that doing so could create a "loss of reverence" for the Eucharist, lead to profanation, and create confusion regarding the teaching of the real presence (Memoriale Domini). His fear has become true in many of our churches.

Perhaps the simple act of receiving Holy Communion on the tongue could help us and others recover a deeper sense of the reverence due to our Blessed Lord by helping us reflect on the fact that the Eucharist should not be handled lightly. Prayerfully consider adopting this practice.

Trust in God's guidance because He sees all things.

## Let us pray.

Lord, nothing escapes your sight. Grant that, by persevering in faith and hope amid our earthly trials, we may come to dwell with you in eternity, where the full extent of your mighty plan will be revealed, and where suffering will be no more. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.
