The BUNAVOLA was first published in 1951. This annual has become increasingly popular on the campus. For the past two years, it has received a "B" rating in yearbook competition.

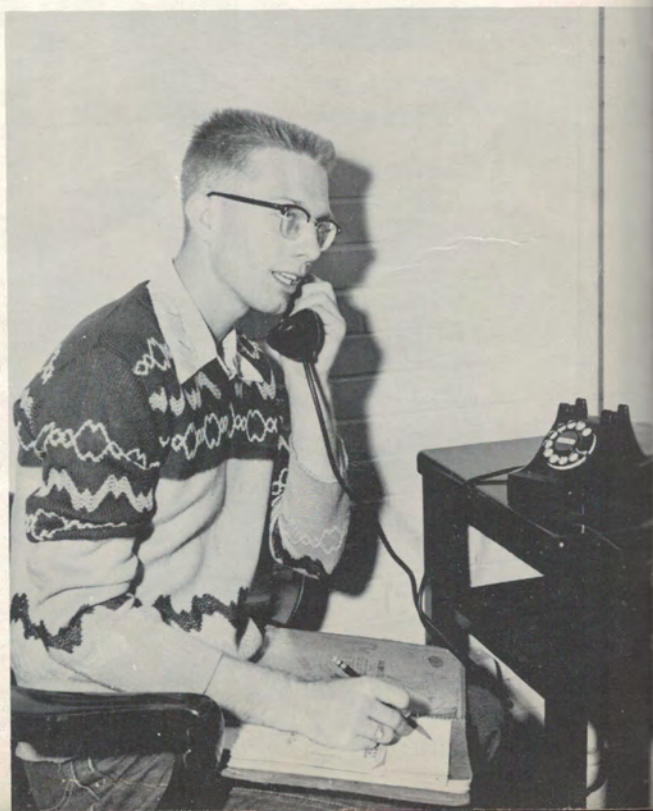
