3.1.3 The solution must include interactive, differentiated online instruction in reading and mathematics that is delivered on the same unified platform as the assessment suite. Solution must include a computer-adaptive diagnostic assessment in Reading and Math that pinpoints strengths and needs to the sub-skill level that is both a criterion-referenced measure and provides national norm scores.		
3.1.4 The assessment must include a differentiated growth model that provides two benchmarks for understanding student growth: the average annual growth of students at each grade and placement level and also the growth recommended to put below-grade level students on a path to proficiency and on-grade level students on a path to advanced proficiency levels. The diagnostic assessment must offer a range of administration times, may be broken into multiple sessions, be untimed, and be designed for administration up to three times per year (beginning, mid, and end of year).
