

How does the PLAY card work?

Students use their school code and student number just like a library card.

For example:

**Echols
County
Schools =
ECSD+12345**

Students can check out up to 5 items at a time fines-free. Just give the librarian your school code and student number when you check out!

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I want my child to have full access to the library collections?

You can apply for a full PINES card at any time.

What if a student already has a library card?

You can continue using the existing library card. Your PLAY account is separate.

What happens when a student graduates?

When a student graduates, their PLAY account will remain active for one year. During that time, they may visit the library in person to apply for a regular PINES library card.

Is student information shared with the library confidential?

Yes, per Official Code of Georgia § 21-12-30(a) Confidential Nature of Certain Library Records.

What is PLAY?

PLAY stands for **Public Library Access for Youth**.

It is an initiative whereby each student at Echols County Schools, Lanier County Schools, Lowndes County Schools, and Valdosta City Schools has access to library materials in the PINES system. Those with a PLAY card have access to a shared collection of more than 11 million materials that can be delivered to their home libraries free of charge. Parents can opt out of the program with the school.
