
LATE POLICY



If work is submitted past the deadline, points will be deducted for each day it is submitted late. After three days, assignments (minor and additional) will be closed.


COURSE DESCRIPTION

GRADING OVERVIEW

Grades are based on a 100-point scale. Major grades consist of tests, projects, and essays. Minor grades consist of classwork, quizzes, and unit work. Additional grades consist of periodic Google Forms, journal entries, and learning check-ins. Students are allowed one retest per subject per quarter; this applies to only one major grade. The higher of the two grades will be recorded in the grade book. There are no redos on minor or additional grades.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

MATERIALS



TECHNOLOGY



Clark-Shaw is a STEM school, and we will use technology in this class. The course will be available through Schoology, in addition, tests and timed writing assignments will be submitted through Schoology. Students are expected to use technology responsibly.

HOMEWORK

Students should attempt to read for 20 minutes each night in order to build fluency and comprehension.
