Houston County School District to Unveil Davis-Nix Field House

HOUSTON COUNTY, GA – Before the start of Friday night's Northside versus Warner Robins football game at McConnell-Talbert Stadium, the current field house will be named the Davis-Nix Field House. The leadership, character, and passion of these two coaches transformed Warner Robins, Georgia into one of the most respected football towns in the state.

Coach Robert Claude Davis led the Warner Robins Demons from 1973 to 1996. Over 24 seasons, Coach Davis compiled an extraordinary 253-41-1 record. His teams captured 18 region championships, three state titles in 1976, 1981, and 1988, and were named national champions twice—in 1976 and 1981. When combined with his success at Westside High School, Coach Davis career total of 354 wins ranks him as the third winningest high school football coach in Georgia history.

Coach Davis never had a losing season. Beyond the victories, he was a mentor and father figure to countless players, teaching lessons of discipline, character, and perseverance that live on to this day.

Coach Conrad Nix led the Northside Eagles for 24 seasons. Under his leadership, Northside achieved a remarkable 241-52 record, won seven region titles, appeared in four state championships, and brought home back-to-back state titles in 2006 and 2007 while going 30-0 across those two seasons.

Coach Nix never had a losing season at Northside and remains the school's winningest coach. His legacy is defined not only by championships but by the values he instilled in his players and the standard of excellence he set for Eagle football.

The Davis-Nix Field House stands as a tribute to two men who shaped generations, elevated programs, and united a community through the game of football. Coach Nix and his family, along with members of Mr. Davis's family, will be in attendance for the unveiling which will begin at 7:00 p.m. in front of the field house.
