Ms. Hollander stated adult education, like the day school, has an evaluation process for its teachers. This is modeled after the professional learning model and focuses on explicit instruction, giving teachers professional learning and resources.

with New Milford. Mrs. Herring asked about new hires being brought in at a step higher than the number of years of experience and what is the reason, specifically for social workers. Mrs. Kavanaugh stated it could happen in an area of subject shortage. Dr. Parlato added, as an example, someone who has certified service and other additional experience of service. They could have 9-10 years experience working, but not be licensed.

C. | Enrollment Report - December 2, 2024

Dr. Parlato stated there is not a lot of variation month to month. Each school is close to projected. Kindergarten is an outlier because of the new legislation.

D. Northville Elementary School Roof

Mr. Cunningham stated a study was done to provide cost estimates. The estimates vary from \$4,000,000 to \$4,700,000. The town will try and put this into the bonding cycle and it is currently in their hands.

E. | Sarah Noble Intermediate School HVAC RFP

Mr. Cunningham stated he understands the system struggles on higher dew point days. An RFP is out and the bids will speak to how these firms would administer updates. The district has received three submissions. There will be an interview process to find out if there is a way we can get the humidity down in the hotter months. It's understood there are a few classrooms struggling, and we're trying to create a better environment for those months.

F. | District Wide HVAC Evaluations

Mr. Cunningham stated all five schools are complete. Deficiencies were found at the two elementary schools, including the rooftops. In the coming months, we will use the information we have and submit it to the state through a questionnaire. This can be used for future grant requests and can evolve into future HVAC projects. Mrs. Herring asked if the improvements are prioritized. Mr.

Cunningham stated yes, this will help decide if we want to include things like air conditioning in places like the gymnasium. There are several buildings where the district would like to see improvements. Mr. O'Brien added, in the study, Mr. Cunningham has highlighted what he feels are our priorities. Mr. Cunningham stated a lot of the leg work is measurements. So now when we do a project, it will be easier to give an engineer specifics. Mr. O'Brien asked if the HVAC grant is in limbo. Dr. Parlato stated we are waiting for the third round. Mr. Cunningham noted that the work that has been done is grandfathered in for a period of time and we can submit the information when the opportunity for the grant comes around again.
