# Five Steps to Get Started:

# Step 1: Prepare Your Classroom

- Learn About Accelerated Reader: We use AR at APS to monitor and celebrate independent reading. Our students are expected to read 15 minutes a day or more independently.
- **Explore Quizzes:** AR has quizzes for over 200,000 books. Students can read books from our library, books from your classroom, books from home or the public library, and even books that they find online.
- Manage Student Accounts: All students have usernames and passwords in the system. If students have trouble logging in, please contact Mrs. B
- Library Books: Label classroom/library books to help students find appropriate reading materials.
  - Our school library is organized by AR levels.
  - It is also sorted by fiction picture books, fiction chapter books, and nonfiction books.
  - It is also sorted by Lower Grade/Middle Grade and Upper Grade books. Upper grade books are restricted for check out to only 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.
  - Students should only go to the library one at a time. Please understand that students might not be supervised in the library.
  - Students should only go to the library if they have a book to bring back. If a student wants to check out 'another' book and have more than one, make sure you are aware of that and you have given permission.
- Preferences: We can adjust settings on the Renaissance Home page for book levels and quiz requirements.
  - Currently students can quiz at any time from any location.
  - Currently students can quiz on books that they have already read as long as it has been at least one year.
  - We are able to change this based on teacher discretion. If at any point you would like to change this, please discuss it with Mrs. B
- **Plan Usage:** Schedule reading practice. Decide if you are building time into your school day or assigning it as homework.

# Step 2: Introduce Accelerated Reader to Students

- **Explain Reading Importance:** Discuss the benefits of reading practice.
- Use Resources: Our students are pretty familiar with AR but you can show student videos on finding books, taking quizzes, and tracking progress if needed.
- **Involve Parents:** Make sure your parents are aware of your expectations with regard to AR goals and how AR will be graded. Share STAR results and other reading reports at parent teacher conferences or as necessary.

# **Step 3: Determine Students' Reading Levels**

- Star Reading: Administer Star Reading tests to determine reading levels and set goals.
  - When student begins this test you have to enter a password (admin)
  - Used to determine optimal reading range for free choice book selection by a student.
  - Also used to determine if students are showing growth.
  - Students take this test multiple times a year (usually at the beginning of each quarter) Students who test at 12+ are excused from taking the test again.

### **Step 4: Personalize Reading Practice**

- Set Goals: Establish individual goals for reading quantity, quality, and complexity.
  - Early Reader Goals (K-2): Tokens and character badges for passed quizzes.
  - **Grades 3-5:** Goals for points, quiz comprehension, and book level or reading amount.
  - Grades 6+: Similar goals to grades 3-5, with a progress line for older students.
- **Discuss Goals:** Explain goals to each student to motivate and guide them.
- **AR Points:** As a school we celebrate student AR achievements with AR prizes. At the beginning of year meeting you will receive more information about this. You will keep track of how many points your students have earned and give AR prizes on a regular basis (this might be weekly, monthly, or quarterly depending on the age of your students)

# **Step 5: Monitor Progress and Celebrate Success**

- **Student Progress:** Students can view their progress online.
- **Teacher Monitoring:** Use the Record Book to track students' progress and quizzes taken. You will log in as an Admin. <u>https://global-zone52.renaissance-go.com/welcomeportal/191759</u>



• We all use the same login. It will lock you out after 3 unsuccessful tries to login. If that happens, let Mrs. B know.

• From this screen you can:

\*Find reports on STAR test results, every quiz your students have taken, and see a diagnostic report. See below for more report information. \*You can monitor reading and set goals

\*You can Manage Content to see if a quiz is available and take a practice quiz.

Other information:

- The AR website can be accessed from anywhere (on my portal). If it isn't loading on a student's chromebook, check that they are connected to the Internet, that they are using the correct username and password, and if it still doesn't load delete cookies.
- Students have individual logins and can also be locked out after 3 unsuccessful tries. Also let Mrs. B know if that happens.
- Students can search for quizzes, take quizzes, and check on their progress. Once they are in a quiz they cannot exit it without finishing. If they accidentally get in the wrong quiz, it is simpler to let them finish and then delete it from the admin side.
- Students should not look at their books while quizzing.
- Most quizzes can be selected to Read Aloud to the student. If the quiz doesn't read aloud to the student, you are welcome to do so.

# Reports to know about:

# The Summary Diagnostic Report:

 Select Reports in the menu. If your home page is Renaissance Next, select Reports under My Data on the left side of the page; then, select Accelerated Reader Reports.

When you go to the Reports page, the Accelerated Reader / Reading Practice tab will be selected.

2. Select **Summary Diagnostic Report** in the Monitor Progress section of the page. (If you have added the report to the Pinned Reports, you'll find it under that section at the top of the page.)

3. Use the **Quiz Type** drop-down list to choose the type of quiz to report on: **All Reading** (which includes <u>Reading Practice</u> <u>Quizzes</u>, <u>Other Reading Quizzes</u>, and Article Quizzes), Reading Practice Quizzes, Other Reading Quizzes, or Article Quizzes.

5. If you want to use demographic data to focus the report on specific students, select **Choose Demographics**.



6. Select the date range you would like to look at. By default, the report will include the current school year. If you want to choose all time, a marking period, or custom dates instead, select the date range field. If you want to use one of the marking periods that have been added to your school, select the marking period in the list. (You can also choose "All Time.")

If you want to use custom dates, select **Custom**. Then, type the start and end dates in the fields (using four

digits for the year), or select the start date and then the end date in the calendar (use the arrows to the left and right of the months to go back or forward). When you're done, select **Apply**.

- Choose the percentage correct threshold for the % diagnostic code: Below 85% or Below 90%.
- 8. Choose the Reading Level Scale: <u>ATOS</u> or Lexile®. The book levels (difficulty levels) on the report will be shown in the scale that you selected.
- If you only want to include classes or groups that have data, check Hide Groups Without Data.
