Page High School- After School Programming

Dear Parent/Guardian:

This year we are offering after school programming for our students. This programming offers a safe and supervised place for students to learn after the school day is over. With the programming, a student has access to an after school snack as well as transportation at no cost. In order to plan for staffing and learning experiences, we ask that you register for our programming as soon as possible. Spots are limited; therefore, some students may be placed on a waiting list.

The attached packet provides you information about transportation, food service, and programming. Everyday attendance is expected; please commit to all days of the program. Take a look at your calendar to ensure the program dates work with your family's schedule.

The deadline for sign ups is August 11, 2023. A school staff member will follow up by phone to confirm enrollment once the application is received.

Program Offerings

Begins August 21, 2023: After School- Tutoring students learn with certified content teachers to accelerate learning and close learning gaps. Students are placed in tutoring for a 6-9 week session and progress is monitored.

Begins August 21, 2023: After School- Credit Recapture After Hours students are assigned course work to recapture credits in order to get back on track for graduation. Students are under the supervision of a certified teacher who will monitor progress, tutor when possible, and proctor assessments.

Begins August 21, 2023: After School- ACT Prep students engage in a 4-6 week session with the goal of increasing their score on the ACT through the use of test taking strategies and content practice. The programming is taught by a certified teacher with experience and training in ACT test preparation.

Begins August 21, 2023: After School- Yearbook/Journalism students engage in learning around speaking, writing, and photography and ultimately produce the annual Sand and Sage PHS Yearbook. Think of this as the Yearbook Club.

Attendance Expectations and Procedures

Attendance is expected everyday of a program. If a student enrolls in a program and doesn't show up for programming or a student misses more than 3 days of programming, the school will make efforts to contact the family. If contact is unsuccessful, the school will open the spot for a student on the waiting list to attend. Please keep contact information up-to-date with your child's school to ensure communication gets through.

Behavior Expectations and Procedures

We aim for engaging learning environments during programming. In order to achieve this, we expect our students to come to programming ready to participate and learn. The school will utilize their established Code of Conduct in order to deliver engaging learning environments for all students. The school will also utilize their established procedures for intervening on and addressing behavior issues that do not meet the Code of Conduct.

Transportation Information

After School Pick Up

After School programming students are to be picked up at the front of the school no later than 4:30pm.

After School Bus Routes

The Page Unified School District offers transportation after school to all eligible students approved to ride; however, the route information is different from the regular school route. If your child will be riding the 4:30 Activity Bus for the first time, please familiarize yourself with the following schedules and service areas to facilitate the pickup of your children. 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Page High School - Credit Recapture After Hours

Dear Senior Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

Page High School is offering an after school programming option as an opportunity for students to make up any failed credits. Students will work to recover credits using the online Edgenuity program with the tutoring support of a certified staff member. Edgenuity credit recovery courses cover only the essential curriculum for the course the student failed. With the programming, a student has access to a no cost after school snack as well as bus transportation.

This letter is to inform you that your **student is off track for 2025 graduation** because he/she is behind on attaining credits. Please make an appointment with your student's counselor to determine graduation progress. Your student is encouraged to register and attend to recover lost credit.
