As an essential part of its budgeting process, the East Glacier Park Grade School (School District #50) Board of Trustees is authorized by law to impose levies to support its budget. The East Glacier Park Grade School Board of Trustees estimates the following changes in revenues and mills for the funds noted below for the next school fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, using certified taxable valuations from the current school fiscal year as provided to the district:

SB307 impacts above are based on the certified taxable valuations from the current school fiscal year (2022-23). Student enrollment for the 2023-24 school year and the final certified taxable valuations available August 1, 2023 may result in changes to these estimates.

Regarding the increase in the building reserve permissive levy referenced above, the following are school facility maintenance projects anticipated to be completed at this time:

- 1. Boiler and Heating System, saving for project.

It is expected, but not guaranteed, that the State of Montana’s Office of Public Instruction will provide a funding match to the Permissive Building Reserve funds up to \$21,000; therefore, taxes would be reduced.

Regarding the increase in the building reserve voted levy referenced above, the following are school facility maintenance projects anticipated to be completed at this time:

1. Boiler and Heating System, saving for project.
2. Air Quality improvements, saving for project.

The Board of Trustees authorizes Denise Mason, Business Manager/Clerk, to adjust the 2022-23 projections for accuracy before publication by March 31, 2023.

Citizens may comment on items appearing on the agenda when invited to participate during that agenda item by the Board Chair. Citizens may comment on items related to School District business not appearing on this agenda during the public comment portion of the meeting. Public meetings may be recorded or broadcast by citizens in accordance with Montana law. Citizens broadcasting or recording a meeting are encouraged to notify the board chair so appropriate accommodations and notifications can be made.

Montana law requires school districts and other public agencies to include on the agenda for public meetings an item allowing public comment on any ***public matter not otherwise specifically listed on the agenda*** that is within the jurisdiction of the agency. As has also been the practice of the District, and in accordance with Montana law, if any Board or public representative desires to speak to an item that is ***specifically listed/identified on the agenda***, you will be allowed to do so at the discretion of the Board chairperson when the item comes up for discussion and action. The public comment portion of the agenda is not the time designated to hear items that are specifically listed/identified on the agenda.

For those individuals who desire to address the Board during the “public comment” portion of the meeting, if you haven’t already done so, please sign your name to the sheet located on the table and indicate the general topic on which you will be commenting. The Board Chairman will call individuals to speak in the order listed on the sheet provided. The Board would like to remind everyone in attendance that to avoid violations of individual rights of privacy, a member of the public wishing to address the Board during this time will not be allowed to make comments about any student, staff member, or member of the general public during his/her designated time to speak. In addition the Board will not hear comments on contested cases or other adjudicative proceedings.

Depending on the number of persons who wish to address the Board, the Board Chairman may place reasonable time limits on comments, in order to maintain and ensure effective and efficient operations of the Board.

By law the District cannot take any action on any matter discussed during the “public comment” portion of the meeting, until such time as the matter is specifically noticed on the agenda, and the public has been allowed the opportunity to comment.

Board meetings are open to the public, but not a public meeting.
