About 250 of our local veterans flooded the cafeteria this year to be served a delicious breakfast prepared by our cafeteria staff. Approximately 75 students were there to help serve, mingle, and learn. After breakfast, everyone was escorted to the auditorium where after the posting of the colors, Mrs. Lopez spoke and honored Missi Forrester for her efforts placing flags at the VA Hospital in Martinsburg, West Virginia. WWII veterans present in the audience were also honored. Musical accompaniments were provided by SASHS Sharps and St. Paul's Brass Band. Attendees listened to the powerful message about selflessness sacrifice by Major Jared Gastrock, a poem recited by Claudia and Caden Garner, and all branches were recognized in the audience. The program ended with the retiring of the colors by the American Legion #223. SASHS Students were happy to participate in this great program and recognize the great sacrifice of these individuals and their families.

On November 8th, the Armed Forces Club visited Fort Indiantown Gap. Students interacted with members of the National Guard and Shippensburg University ROTC members. Students participated in training simulators and took a tour of the Eastern Army National Guard Aviation Training Site. Inside the training facility, students saw Black Hawk and Chinook helicopters that are used to train the National Guards' maintenance technicians. Students also were able to walk out on the runway and watch a Chinook helicopter perform training maneuvers.





On November 9th, students participated in the Hospitality Career Bootcamp at the Harrisburg Holiday Inn. During this trip, students made fresh pasta, fresh mozzarella, and chocolate cake truffles with dark chocolate mousse. FFA Members Attend National Convention Brianna Foor, Shippensburg FFA Reporter

Early one Tuesday morning in October, 10 FFA members loaded up for their trip to Indianapolis for the 95th National FFA Convention. Over 69,000 people attended the convention from all over the United States. During their drive out, they made a stop at Waterman Dairy Center which is part of Ohio State University.

There, they learned about what the farm is used for and the processes they go through. They got a tour of the

farm, the milking parlor, learned about the activity trackers, and got insight from a graduated college student who now works on the farm. Wednesday morning, the members got a tour of Beasley's Orchard and learned about how they make their Apple Cider. That afternoon, the members got their registration and badges and attended the Opening Session at Lucas Oil Stadium. Thursday and Friday were mainly spent at the convention center. This gave the members time to explore the Expo, and participate in workshops, explore career opportunities, visit with potential colleges, do some shopping, and participate in lots of hands-on activities. During the evenings, they went bowling and played mini golf at an arcade and attended the Cinch Rodeo. They all had a blast at the convention and the memories will last forever!
