- Great Start

* Each day you will begin class by reading a portion of the book, *The Essential 55.* You will complete a reading log for each day, and respond to that day's reading. This will be kept in a notebook that you will graded at the end of the grading period.

- Activities:

* We will complete various activities during the year. It can be worksheets, class assignments, Presentations, and other assignments. A penalty of 2 points per day will be assessed for late work.

- Projects:

There will be various projects throughout the year. These will include, but not limited to:

* We will periodically read articles related to the unit we are studying, or about a theme or idea in education. You will be given 20 minutes to read the article and write a reflection on it.
