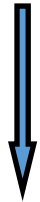
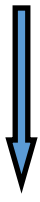
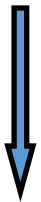


## **WORLD LANGUAGES**

Students who are unable to access the above courses have the option of taking a non-sequential World Language course that meets the Connecticut state requirement for graduation, but will not prepare students to progress to any additional language classes. This course is by recommendation only.

Each language track ends in the senior year with classes that earn credits from the University of Connecticut which are transferrable to most universities. Students in both French and Latin earn 3 UConn credits in their junior and senior year for a total of 6 credits. Students in UConn Spanish V earn 6 credits and students in Perspectives on Latin America (available in addition to Spanish V) earn 3 credits.

Students are also encouraged to take more than one World Language if they are interested.
