LHHS SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer school dates are Thursday, June 1st- Thursday, June 29th.

- Students will participate in a hybrid schedule of 1.5 hours on campus with the expectation of an additional minimum of 2.5 hours per school day spent online.
- Summer School course options include most of our core classes or Credit Recovery.



Counselors met with all students during February and March for Pre-Registration and discussed which classes
would be advised to take in Summer School if any credits are missing and sent students home with a copy of their
graduation credit breakdown including any summer school recommendations. Please check in with your student
about this Pre-Registration lesson and paperwork.

Students who enroll in this program will have online/Zoom class options as well as onground MCC in-person instruction options. The program will run from May 22nd through July 20th. Students need to complete an MCC admissions application and take the placement test. FULL Scholarships are provided for Tuition and Fees. Course materials are provided at no cost. Just a reminder, counselors are assigned based on the student's last name.



New Nurses at LHHS








GRADUATION INFORMATION 2023

Lake Havasu High School

Thursday, May 25, 2023 - 7:30 pm
Gates open at 6:00pm



Graduation is fast approaching, and I know many of you have questions. This informational letter will hopefully provide you with answers to most of your questions. Please read this letter carefully and keep it for reference.

OBLIGATIONS Students are required to fulfill <u>ALL</u> disciplinary and/or financial obligations *prior* to graduation, or their diplomas will be withheld, and they cannot participate in the ceremony. Obligations include serving detention hours owed, returning all school property to our school or school you may have transferred from. For example, books, athletic equipment, borrowed standardized clothing, paying book fines, library fines, and paying fees, etc.

SENIOR FINALS Final exams for seniors will be during the week of May 15-19. Seniors who do not pass a required course will be notified by May 22 that they will not graduate, nor will they be able to walk at graduation.

COURSE COMPLETION THROUGH MCC OR AN ONLINE INSTITUTION All course work and final exams from online classes must be completed by May 12. Students taking online classes or classes at MCC must request that an official transcript be sent to the high school by May 12. In addition to requesting an official transcript, students taking spring classes at MCC must print out an unofficial transcript from their "myMohave" account and submit it to their counselor. All grades from online classes (including any from MCC) must be posted by May 19 for a student to participate in graduation ceremonies.

BACCALAUREATE Baccalaureate is a non-denominational religious service that is a traditional part of graduation. The ceremony will take place on Monday, May 22 at 7:00 pm. Information from the Baccalaureate committee will be mailed separately. Caps and gowns must be worn. Graduates are asked to gather in the hallway of the Performing Arts Center (PAC) at the west side by 6:45 pm. There will be a processional into the PAC by the graduating class. Parents and guests should be seated in the PAC. Everyone is invited to attend; tickets are not required and a reception will follow. Baccalaureate is sponsored by the Lake Havasu Ministerial Association & Christian Youth Workers Round Table.

GRADUATION PRACTICES Practice sessions will be on Tuesday, May 23, and Wednesday, May 24. **We will start promptly at 7:30 am** on the football field. Practice should not last more than two hours; however, it could last up to 3 hours. Plan accordingly to be available for the entire practice. **Graduating seniors must attend both practices. If you have a conflict, see Mrs. Miller in the administration office as soon as possible. Students should wear comfortable clothing; sunglasses and a cap are suggested, and shoes are required.**

TICKETS FOR GRADUATION All tickets for the graduation ceremony will be distributed to the graduates during practice on Wednesday, May 24. Each graduate will be granted five tickets for the graduation ceremony.

SENIOR BREAKFAST Wednesday morning, May 24, 2023, immediately following practice, all senior class members are invited to breakfast in the Football Field Parking Lot.

CAPS & GOWNS Caps and gowns are the property of the students. The gown should be removed from the plastic bag upon receipt and placed on a hanger to allow the folds to fall out. Stubborn creases may be pressed out on a low heat/rayon setting on the wrong side of the fabric using a pressing cloth. Caps should not be decorated or altered in any way for the ceremony aside from the direction of HB2705.

Caps are worn on the head so that the mortarboard is leveled with the crown's long point to the back. Graduates should wear with the front point worn down on the forehead. Girls are advised to check their hairstyle before graduation night to make sure that the cap looks right. The cap should NOT be worn on the back of the head. The tassel is worn to the RIGHT. Tassels should never be pinned or sewn but allowed to hang naturally. When the graduate has crossed the stage during the ceremony, the tassel is moved to the LEFT side.

HONOR CORDS, MEDALLIONS, and EXTERIOR DECORATION Only school-issued honor cords or medallions may be worn as a decoration outside the gowns aside from HB2705, Military, and Mayoral Youth Leadership. *No flowers, leis, etc., may be worn.*

COMMENCEMENT ATTIRE Graduating seniors are required to dress appropriately – **no flip-flop sandals, spiked high-heeled shoes, tee shirts, cut-offs, or shorts.** Appropriate dress for male graduates at Baccalaureate and Graduation is dress slacks, a light-colored shirt (necktie optional), dark socks, and dress shoes. Appropriate dress for female graduates at Baccalaureate and Graduation is a dress, skirt, or slacks and blouse, and dress shoes. Walking across the field in high heels is difficult (spiked high-heels are not allowed). Students not appropriately dressed will not be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony. The gown must be carried to the ceremony and put on upon arrival at the main gym. Plan ahead – place gown, cap, and tassel together to prevent forgetting part of it. Parking for seniors will be in the lot north of the school by the main gym. Seniors should plan to be in the main gym no later than 7 pm. *Only graduates will be admitted in the main gym*. The entire graduation program will take approximately one and one-half hours. The gym will be locked after graduation, so seniors should not leave personal belongings in the gym.

SEATING AND PARKING FOR GUESTS Seating will be limited to guests with tickets. This includes young children occupying a seat. Tickets are not required for lap infants. Lake Havasu City Police Officers and faculty members will be at the gate to allow entry for all ticket holders. **No ice chests, coolers, or containers** of any kind are permitted on the premises for this occasion. Water will be available. Parking is available in the student lot east of the school, the faculty lot behind the cafeteria (limited), and in the parking lot adjacent to the football field.

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY RULES Use, possession, or distribution of alcohol, tobacco, non-prescription drugs, or narcotics on school grounds or at school activities is the reason for removing anyone from the area (Arizona Revised Statute #4-244). Lake Havasu City Police Officers will be present before and during the Commencement Ceremony. They will aid administrators and staff members in making sure there are no infractions of this rule. If any student is under the influence of alcohol or drugs, he/she will be turned over to police officers and will not be allowed to go through graduation ceremonies; charges will also be filed. Lake Havasu High School is a smoke-free campus; parents and guests must also refrain from smoking while on any part of the campus, including e-cigarettes/vape.

COMMENCEMENT ETIQUETTE Graduation is a formal event. All guests present are asked to cooperate during the ceremony with the dignified behavior that is due to such a memorable occasion. Hornblowers or noisemakers will not be permitted into the facility. Please keep in mind that when your graduate's name is read aloud and the noise you make may drown out the following graduate's name being reading. In addition, entry to the ceremony must be by way of the front gates on Palo Verde S. **Guests should not cross the bridge before or during the ceremony. This will not be an entrance or an exit for the event.**

PICTURE TAKING For your convenience, we have made arrangements with LifeTouch Photography to record the moment as the senior receives his/her diploma. Pictures can be purchased online through LifeTouch. There is no obligation to purchase. This service will enable each student to have a photograph of graduation if desired. Family members and friends should remain in their seats and enjoy the ceremony. After the ceremony, parents will be invited to come onto the field to take photographs. No spectators are allowed in the graduates' area of the field.

DIPLOMAS When the graduate crosses the stage, he/she will receive a diploma cover. Counselors will hand out the actual diploma as the student is walking back to his/her seat. Students misbehaving during the ceremony will not receive their diplomas and must meet with an administrator. Again, obligations must be fulfilled for a senior to receive a diploma or walk in the ceremony.

IN CASE OF RAIN If it is raining on the day of graduation, notification will come from the school and ask that you only act on information from the school's messaging system.


