I hope everyone had a nice spring break and extra day off. With the nicer weather, we are able to do more activities with science outside. We planted a seed before spring break in a clear cup. Students get to observe their seed and record the results in their observation journal. It's pretty exciting to see the roots as our seeds grow into plants. This week we experimented with Peeps. Students were able to observe Peeps in water, clear pop, and vinegar to see what happened in each liquid. They also put a Peep in a plastic bag with vinegar and baking soda.

This week we are learning about measuring by comparing two objects using shorter than, longer than, or about the same. Students are also having fun with math talks. We play a game 'Which one doesn't belong'.

Next week we will start our animal research projects. Students will learn about an animal, collect information, and present it to the class.
