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Description of the School

Freedom Elementary School is located in Christian County, Kentucky, situated in Western Kentucky on the Kentucky-Tennessee border. Christian County covers 724 square miles and is one of the largest school districts in the state. Freedom Elementary is one of seven elementary schools in the Christian County Public School District, and is located in the city of Hopkinsville. Freedom serves kindergarten through fifth grade. Freedom Elementary's student population is 478 students. FES serves an economically disadvantaged population, with 95.84% of our students receiving free or reduced lunch. Our demographic breakdown consists of 48.74% African-American, 29.5% White (nonHispanic), 11.72% Two or More Races, and 10.04% Hispanic. Our special education population is 21% of the total school population. This demographic information is representative of the community that is zoned to Freedom Elementary School but is significantly higher than Hopkinsville or Christian County. Out of 19 teachers in grades K-5, 16 are returning for the 25-26 school year. Freedom added ten ambassador teacher positions for the 23-24 school year to mentor other teachers in the school. The Teacher Ambassador positions will remain in place for the 2025-2026 school year. Each Ambassador is responsible for a school wide initiative to implement during the school year.

This collaborative approach creates a strong sense of shared responsibility and pride, allowing the school to remain responsive, inclusive, and true to its mission of fostering lifelong learners.
