Course Overview

Journalism is designed to teach students the various forms of journalism, application and analysis of media, as well as writing skills. Students will engage in multiple forms of media, with a strong focus in newspaper writing. This course is supplemental to the school newspaper, and students are expected to contribute articles to the production of the paper. However, the success of the paper will not be reflected in the grade for the class.

Responsibilities & Expectations

This is primarily a PRODUCTION DRIVEN CLASS, meaning you are REQUIRED to write original content for the newspaper. This may require time outside of class. The classroom be will be open after school to help learners with deadlines.

Grading Policy

Executive 10% Including but not limited to homework, participation, etc.

Minor 30% Including but not limited to quizzes, rough drafts, individual components of projects, etc.

Major 60% Including but not limited to unit assessments, projects, essays, labs. Etc.

Reassessment Policy

Learners who score below a 70% may receive opportunities to demonstrate what they know and are able to do through reassessment on priority standards only.

Learners can reassess twice each semester in each subject.

Upon completing a reassessment the maximum score the learner can receive is scaled to 70%.

The lead learner will communicate with learners and their parent(s)/guardian(s) the standards that will be eligible for reassessment at the beginning of each grading period.
