The Pittston Hospital School of Nursing Class of 1982 has established the following scholarship through donations from members of this graduating class.

Pittston Hospital School of Nursing was a 3 year diploma program in Pittston, PA which began in 1903. The school closed its doors officially in 1988 after being transferred to the King's College campus in Wilkes-Barre. The school of nursing had strong character building philosophies with the mission to educate and prepare a person to become a Registered Nurse capable of caring for individuals in need of medical help. The class of 1982 was a very cohesive group of 26 females and 2 males with a desire to promote nursing as a career in the past, present and into the future. We hope to carry that philosophy forward with this scholarship.

The \$250.00 scholarship is awarded to a graduating Wyoming Area student who in the estimation of the members of the nursing class, possesses the ability, desire and character which is believed will enable him/her to become an outstanding professional registered nurse and/or healthcare provider.

All applicant must be accepted into a 2 or 4 year college with a major in nursing (Registered Nurse) or healthcare field. Preference will be given first to nursing careers. A selection committee from the Class of 1982 PHSN will make the final decision re: the recipient of this award.

Any other majors will NOT be considered. Financial need will be considered.
