Welcome to all guests with us as we host the annual Fall Festival at St. Edward's this Sunday. I hope we all enjoy good

Monday, September 19, is the feast of St. Januarius (whose name is often spelled with a 'g'), who was a bishop and martyred in 304 in the persecution of Diocletian. He served in Benevento but died and is honored in Naples. The faithful piously collected his blood in a vial that is still in existence to this day. On September 19, there is a ceremony at the Cathedral in Naples where they solemnly display the vial and though clotted and dry, it liquifies, and the few times that it did not were taken as signs of disaster. We of course are not demanded to put our faith in

such things, but it is an interesting thing about our faith.

On September 19, 2001, still reeling from the attacks of 9/11,
Bishop Lucker died. Please continue to keep him and Bishop Schladweiler who died April 3, 1996, in your prayers, especially as we look forward to the formal installation of our fifth bishop

Most Reverend Chad Zielinski next Tuesday.

Speaking of the installation, the installation itself is closed to all except those with tickets. There is, however, a prayer service the night before at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity, New Ulm, at 6 pm which is open to all. I hope that many can attend. As you might imagine, there are many events next week related to the installation as well as the DMA Bishop's Guild Dinner, so keep Bishop Zielinski in your prayers. To help, the Diocese of New Ulm has provided the following prayer:


