For the sixth consecutive year, the Dawson Springs High School Boys Cross Country team topped its competitors at the Region 1 Class 1A meet held on Oct. 26, at Marshall County. In a close contest, the Panthers finished first with an average time of 18:08 over teams from Murray, University Heights, Fort Campbell, Hickman County, Crittenden County, Fulton County, Heritage Christian Academy & Livingston Central. Easton Bourland crossed

the line first with Deacon Dever & Montgomery Johnson close behind in 4th & 5th place. Consistent yearly improvement landed the Girls Cross Country a 1st place finish at Regional competition and a 4th consecutive trip to state competition. The team finished with an average time of 23:30 besting teams from Murray and Crittenden County. Olivia Hines crossed the finish line 2nd with Baylee Swatzell finishing 4th. Ashtyn Swatzell and Alieah Cook placed 6th & 7th.

The Regional wins send both teams to KHSAA state competition on Saturday, Nov. 2, at the New Horse Park in Lexington, KY.



Children enrolled in KCHIP are covered for:

- doctors' visits
- hospital stays and emergency services
- mental health services
- lab tests and X-rays
- prescription drugs
- immunizations
- speech therapy
- health screenings
- dental, hearing and eye checkups

Applying is easy. A face-to-face interview is not required. To apply for KCHIP:

- print a mail-in application online at kidshealth.ky.gov
- apply in person at your local Community Based Services office
