Pike County High School will:

- 1. - 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Compacts will be distributed on the first day of school, August 9, 2021, and the contents of the compact will be discussed at parent-teacher events throughout the school year. In addition, parent-teacher conferences will be held at PCHS on Oct. 14, 2021 and March 17, 2022.
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide progress reports as follows: 9/9/21; 11/18/21; 2/10/22, and 4/14/22. Report cards will be given out on 10/14/21, 1/13/22, and 3/17/22. PowerSchool can also be used to check progress daily. In addition, individual teachers will notify parents when a student is failing his/her class at any time during the school year.
- 4. **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for meeting with parents before and after school and during their planning blocks. Arrangements for conferences should be made with individual teachers or through the main office.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities.
- 6. Ensure regular, two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand. As needed, all communication will be translated into the family's native language.

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning by...

- Monitoring attendance and grades through PowerSchool or progress reports.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Monitoring the amount of television my child watches.
- Monitoring the use of technology and social media accounts.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.

- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child, by mail, or email, and responding, as appropriate.

- Attending parent-teacher conferences via phone, virtual, or in-person.
- Providing a quiet study area for online learning.
