Dear Parents,

The federal Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) requires schools who receive Title I, Part A funds to notify parents or legal guardians when their child has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a teacher who has not met state certification/licensure requirements. In Washington, this notification requirement will go out for any teacher with a limited certification. In some cases, we have had to fill teaching assignments in core academic subjects with teachers on emergency licenses or permits when licensed teachers were not available to hire.

As of the date of this letter, your child's teacher _____ has a limited state certification/licensure, such as Provisional Teacher Certificate, Emergency Substitute, or Intern Substitute Teacher.
