Dear Parishioners,

This last week we settled most of the estate for my mom. As suspected, there was no estate left after the funeral expenses. Thanks to many memorial gifts and insurance, what is left unpaid is minimal (under \$1500). We will need to work with the hospital and clinic to settle their accounts, but from what I am told, we are not financially responsible for the bills if there was not enough for a modest funeral. Thank you for your support and prayers. While I will continue to grieve and have it hit at random times, I also know that we have honored her well and entrust her to our loving Savior.

As I see the egg shelf bare, I am certain that my Mom would have been upset. The egg is a sign of new life and hope. A friend wrote a book based on the legend of the Easter Egg – according to a tradition, Joseph of Arimathea was bringing eggs into Jerusalem when he was forced into service to carry the cross of Jesus. Mom loved coloring Easter eggs, even though her youngest grandchild is 15 already. Every year, Mom would hard boil a couple dozen, and assure that there were deviled eggs on the Easter table. But she would also color raw eggs, attempting to be careful to keep them separate. All the same, there were a few surprises. Cracking an egg after she had colored them was always 'fun' – would the hoped-for hard-boiled egg end up running through our fingers, or would we have to eat a hard-boiled egg instead of making scrambled eggs? I will miss that little thing.

Next week is Holy Week already. I love the various liturgies, and hope that many will come and worship our Lord who gave Himself to us for our salvation. Our Sunday Fire is about the Triduum – the three sacred days of Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday.

PREDATORY SPORTS GAMBLING

Help protect Minnesotans from predatory gambling

- Urge your state representative to vote NO on H.F. 778—a bill that would legalize online sports gambling for people as young as 18 years old.
- Catholics should be concerned that legislators are seeking to provide an entertainment option for a privileged few, at the expense of our youth, the poor, and the vulnerable.
- The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2413) states that games of chance (card games, bingo, etc.) or wagers are not in themselves contrary to justice. But it also warns that "the passion for gambling risks becoming an enslavement," and that wagers "become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others."


