Parent Engagement Plan

Johnson Elementary will provide opportunities for parental engagement by offering a forum for collaboration with faculty, learning activities that will complement student education and updated information about Title I programs. The following are the major components of the plan that include a shared responsibility approach to help improve and maintain high student academic achievement:

- 1. A parent involvement meeting will take place at the beginning of the school year to inform parents about the purpose of Title I and the school's involvement in the program. A morning and afternoon meeting option will be available. During the meeting, the school will review:**
 - a. The School-Parent Compact
 - b. 1% Set-Aside Parent Engagement Funds
 - c. Title I Budget Information/Planned Expenditures for the upcoming year
 - d. Continuous Improvement Plan
 - e. Opportunities to communicate with administration and staff to improve the academic performance of their child

- 2. Throughout the school year, several opportunities will be provided that encourage greater collaboration between parents, students, and faculty. These opportunities will include:**
 - a. Open House will be hosted at the beginning of the school year to allow parents and students to see their teachers and gain information about the upcoming school year.
 - b. Parent Conferences will be held in the fall and spring semesters. Individual conferences are also available upon request.
 - c. Open Invitation to our Parent Resource Room which is staffed by our parent liaison. Mrs. Wendy Yeager (wendy.yeager@lcsk12.org) is a valuable resource to parents. Please reach out to her if your family is in need.
 - d. PTO will hold meetings in the library throughout the school year. For more ways to be involved contact PTO at jesrebelspto@gmail.com.
 - e. JES Newsletter will be sent home with reminders about upcoming events and ways in which the parents may be involved
 - f. The school will provide reading and multi-sensory intervention services for at-risk students. These students will be identified by using various forms of data including DIBELS Benchmark & Progress Monitoring Scores, STAR Reading, STAR Math, ACAP, weekly assessments, and LCS-approved screeners.
 - g. After-school Tutoring and Summer Reading Camps are offered to students who struggle in reading.
 - h. A Literacy & Math Night will be scheduled during the school year.
 - i. Parent Advisory Committee to assist in providing feedback and brainstorming of ideas on how to improve Johnson Elementary.

- 3. Surveys will be distributed throughout the school year to all parents. The feedback from the surveys will allow the school to evaluate its effectiveness and the Title I program. The survey results will be used to implement changes to improve the overall Title I program at Johnson Elementary.**
