Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the agenda.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the minutes from all previous meetings.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the financial report for the month ending April 2007.

Public Comment – None at this time.

Moved, seconded, and carried to approve the tentative budget for FY2008. Mrs. Mercier discussed with the board a time line for the budget and it was decided the budget would be advertised on June 22 and June 29. Then a special session would be held on June 29 to receive public comment and afterwards the budget would be approved.

Karen Walton, Principal of West Fannin Elementary, gave an update on the School Improvement process at West Fannin Elementary.

Jill Key, Fannin High School Graduation Specialist, and Marilyn Reece, Fannin Middle School Graduation Specialist, did a presentation on the job duties of a graduation specialist and the role each plays in the schools.

Sandy Acker, School Nurse, gave a presentation on the need for defibrillators at each school. The board moved, seconded, and carried to purchase seven defibrillators (one for Blue Ridge Elementary, East Fannin Elementary, West Fannin Elementary, Fannin County Middle School, Fannin County High School, Performing Arts Center, and Fannin County High School Gym).

Moved, seconded, and carried to employ Althea Davenport as a School Nutrition Worker.

Moved, seconded, and carried to reappoint Lynn Doss as School Board Attorney for fiscal year 2008.

Board Members' Comments:

Emily Dunn thanked Karen Walton for her presentation. Mrs. Dunn also thanked the graduation coaches for coming out and giving a presentation on what a graduation coach does. Mrs. Dunn further stated everyone was invited to attend a reception on Sunday, June 24 in honor of Mrs. Mercier.

Terry Bramlett stated he appreciated everyone who attended the board meeting. Mr. Bramlett also stated he appreciated the presentations given.

Junior Farmer stated he appreciated what Sandra Mercier has done for Fannin County Schools over the past 34 years.

Garnett Webb thanked Karen Walton for her presentation. Mr. Webb stated he has enjoyed working with Mrs. Mercier these past three years. He further stated Fannin County Schools have been very fortunate to have her as Superintendent for the past five years.

Bobby Bearden stated he was glad to be here. Mr. Bearden thanked everyone for coming out. Mr. Bearden stated he always believed in Mrs. Mercier and she had never proved him wrong.

Superintendent's Comments:
