IMPORTANT MESSAGE

We have recently received calls from both community members that live on Spruce Drive and from elementary school families concerned about unsafe driving practices on Spruce Drive coming to and from our campus.

Spruce Drive has multiple cars parked on both sides of the road, three crosswalks between Wahanna and the Pacific Ridge campus, and multiple elementary-aged students present at the time of dismissal.

Oregon Law requires that all vehicles stop for an occupied crosswalk and that all cars adhere to the 20 mph speed limit on Spruce Drive.

We have been notified by the Seaside Police Department that there will be enhanced patrols on Spruce Drive for the foreseeable future.

SMS DENTAL SEALANTS

Oregon Health Authority in partnership with Providence Seaside Hospital will be at Seaside Middle School to apply free dental sealants Tuesday, February 8th through Friday, February 11th.

This free screening will be available to ALL 6th, 7th, and 8th graders.

If you are interested in your student taking advantage of this wonderful opportunity, please turn in this completed consent form to your student's homeroom teacher as soon as possible. You can either print the form, complete it and send it to school with your student or you can download the form, fill it out electronically, save it and attach it in an email to tboyd@seasidek12.org.

This program is staffed by a dental assistant and dental hygienist from OHA as well as Providence's Community Impact Care Coordinator. Dental sealants are critical in maintaining dental health and preventing dental decay. We have been able to utilize this program for many years, which is especially important in South County where dental resources for our families are extremely limited.

STUDENT ID'S & RIDING THE BUS

Seaside School District has implemented a Student ID Bus Pass program that uses Tyler Drive technology for students who ride district buses to and from school. The purpose of this program is to allow Transportation Services (through the use of a secure App) to know when and where each student enters and exits the bus on their assigned route. Student ID Bus Passes utilizes a passive RFID badge attached to a student's backpack or a lanyard which communicates with the Bus Pass scanner located on the bus. Seaside School District provides this service at no cost.

The Student ID Bus Pass badge will serve as a bus pass for students using district provided transportation services. Students who fail to follow this protocol will be subject to their school's discipline guidelines. In accordance with OAR 581-021-0505, parents as well as students 14 and older, have the option to opt-out of the electronic monitoring capabilities of the Student ID Bus Pass program. It is important to note that students who opt-out of the electronic monitoring portion of the program will still need to show their Student ID Bus Pass to ride a district school bus. If you do not want your student(s) to participate in the electronic monitoring portion of the Student ID Bus Pass program, please see the District website transportation [RFID Opt-Out form](#).

If your student loses their ID card they will be charged a \$5 card replacement fee.

Thank you for helping your student remember to bring their card with them to school each day!

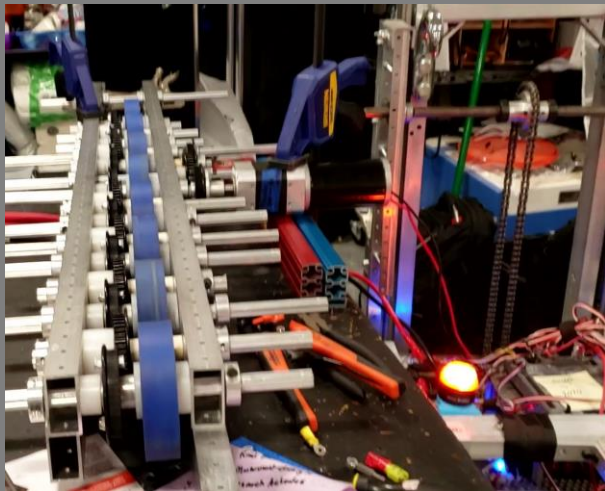
SHS ROBOTICS
