Maroon and Gray: It's In Our Blood

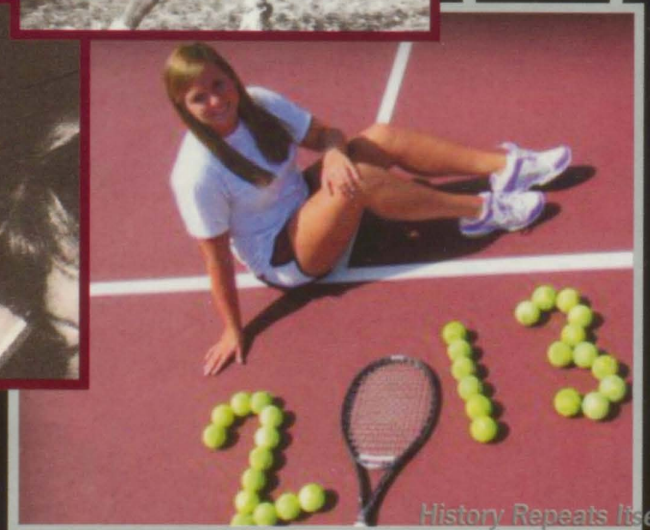

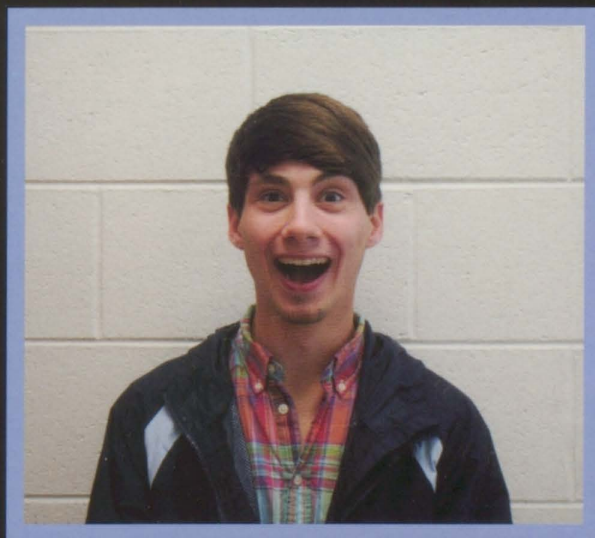

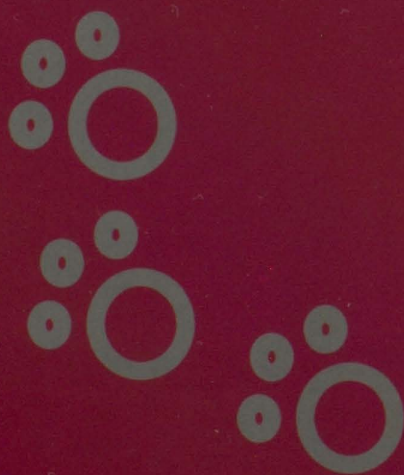

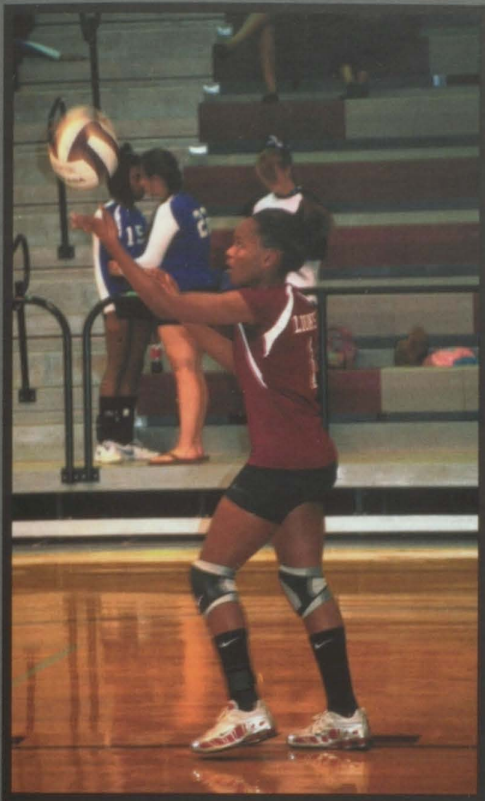

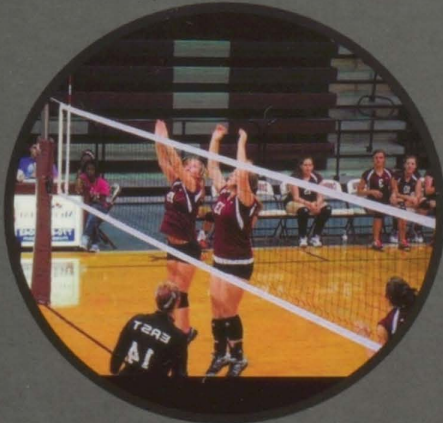

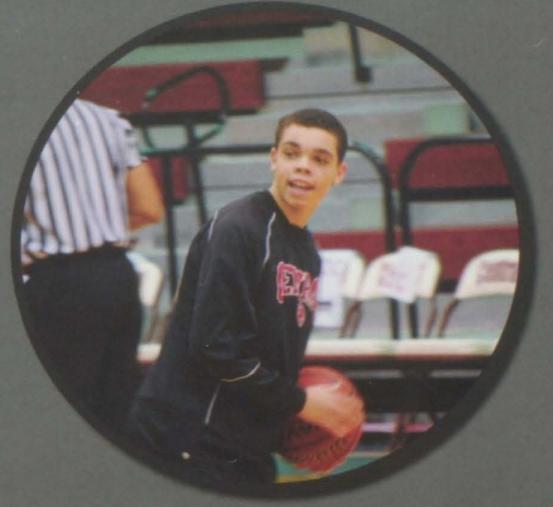

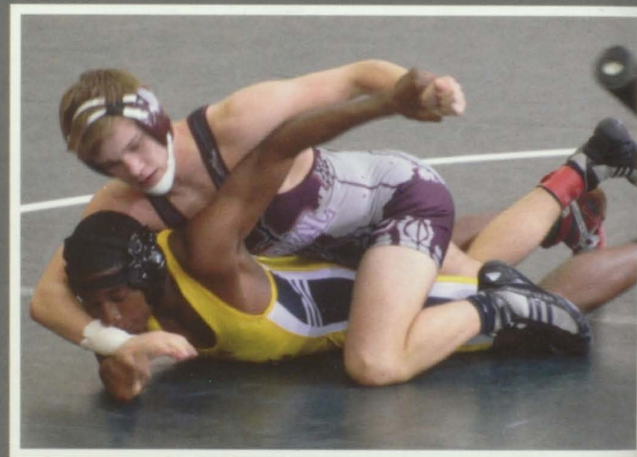

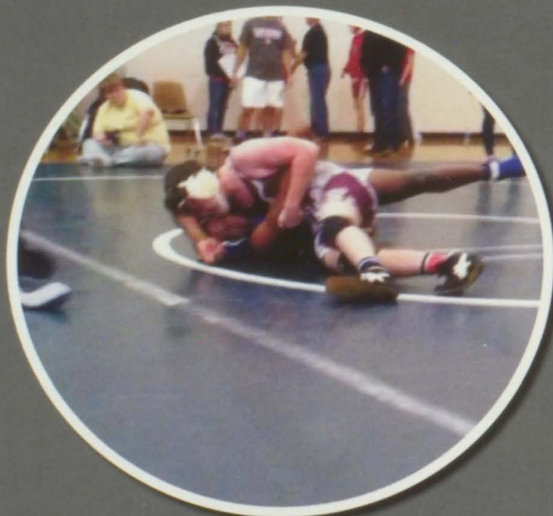

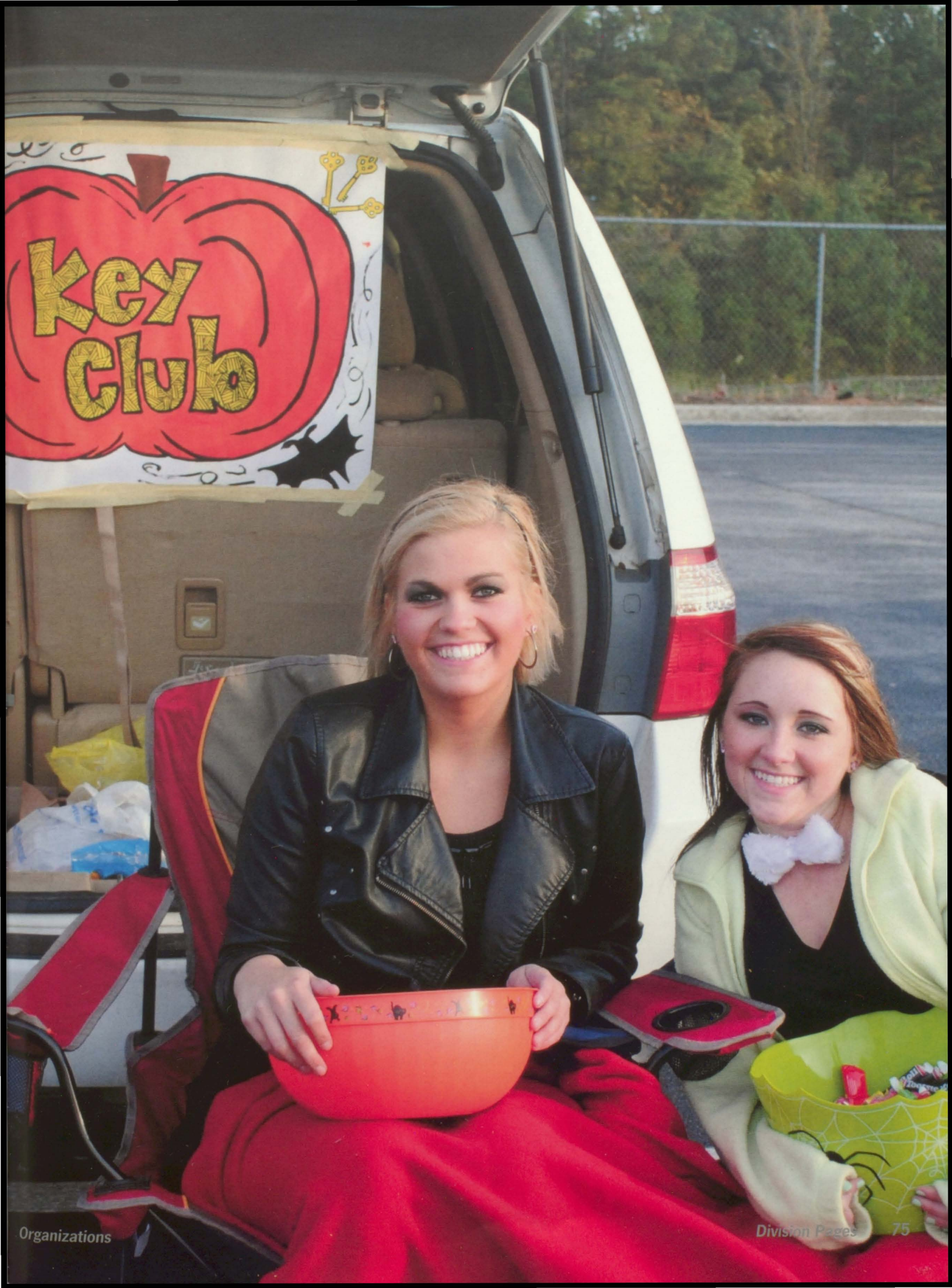

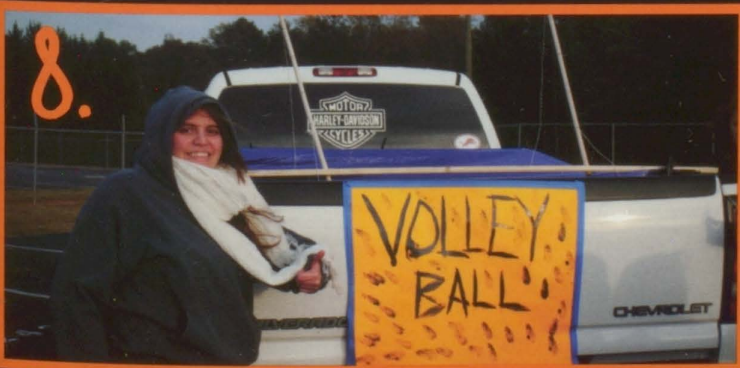
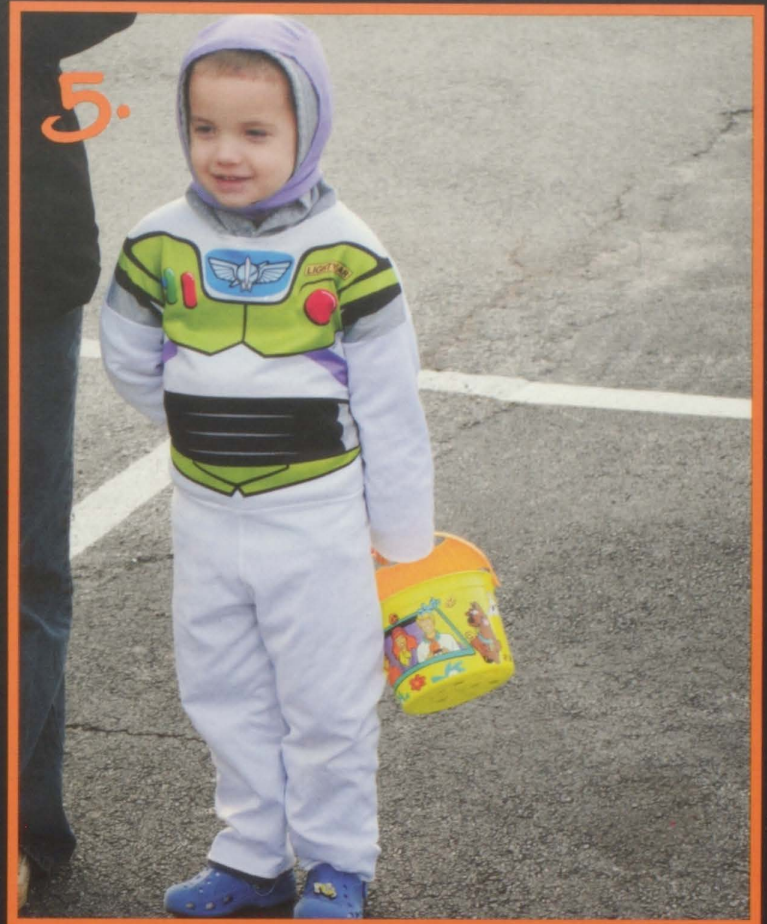


Trunk OR Treat

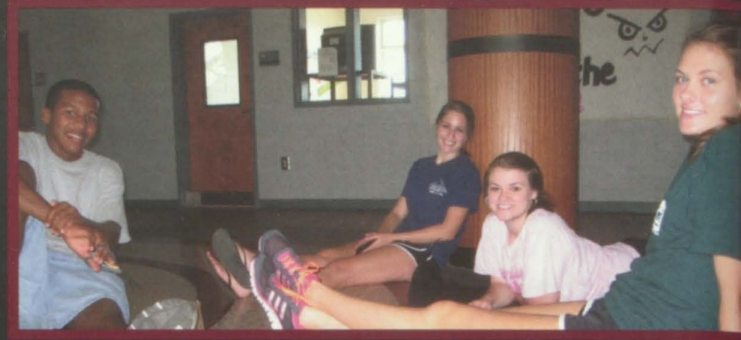

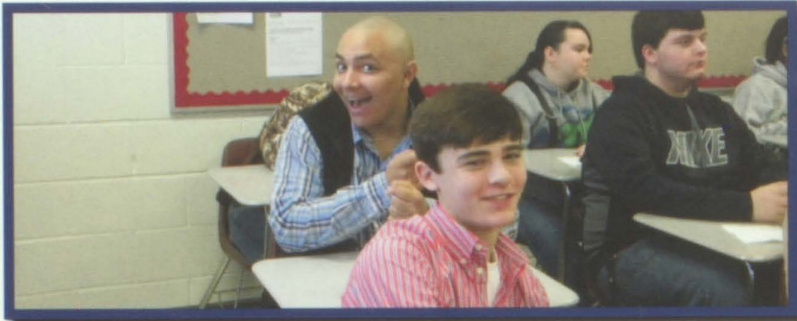

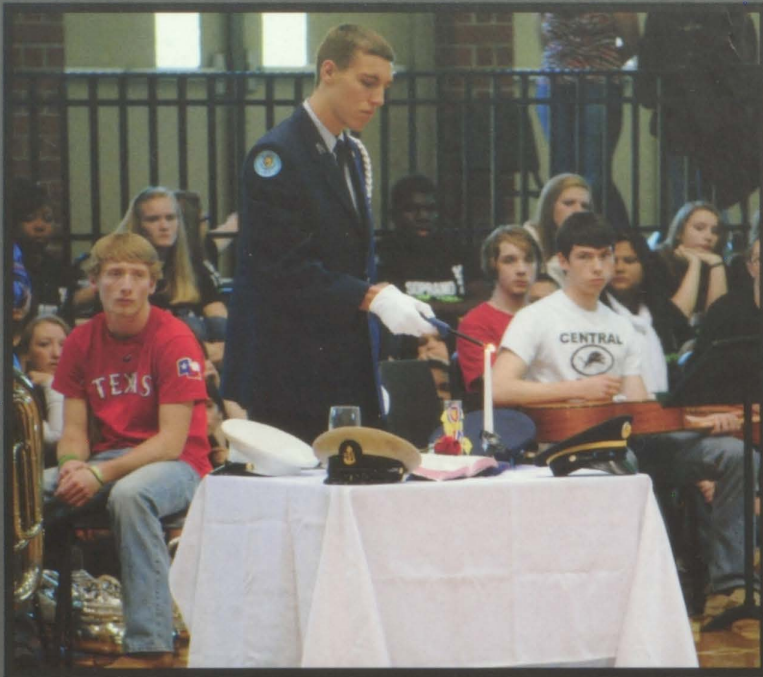

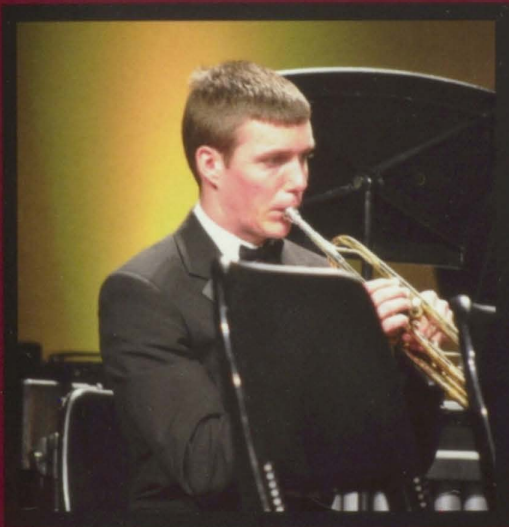

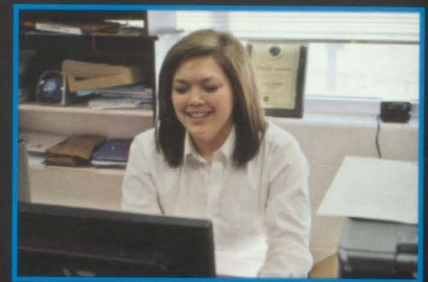

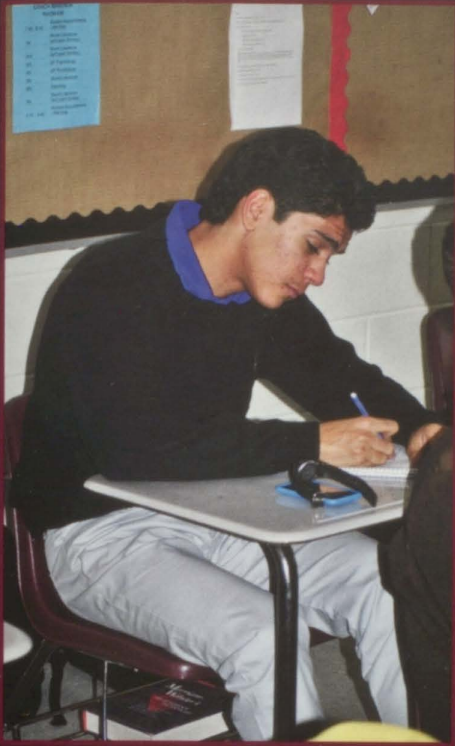

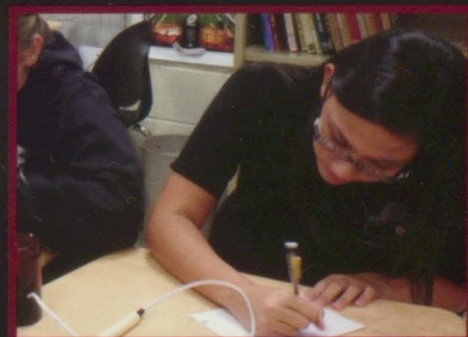

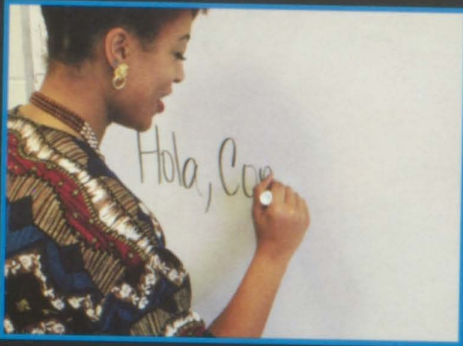

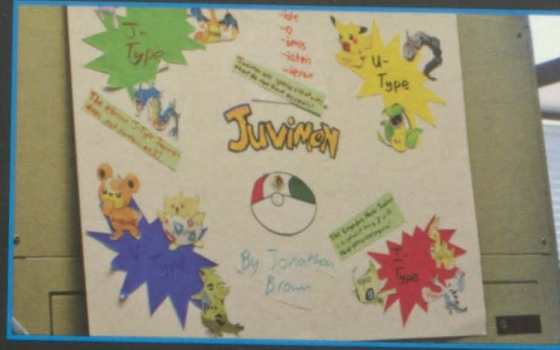

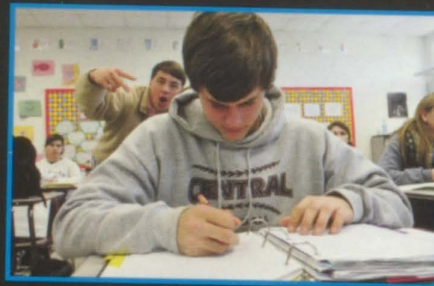

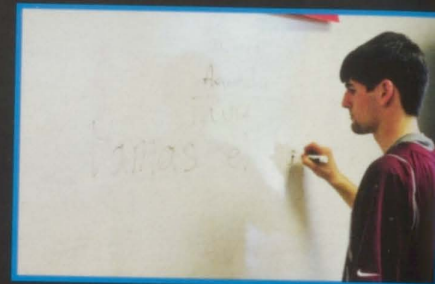

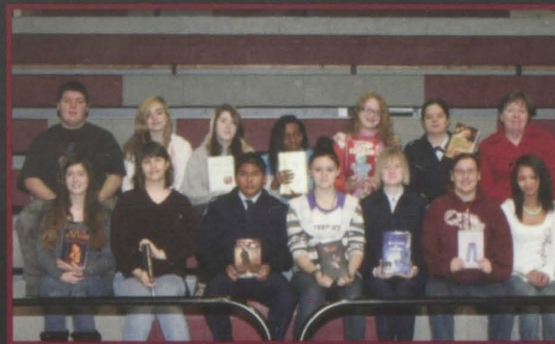

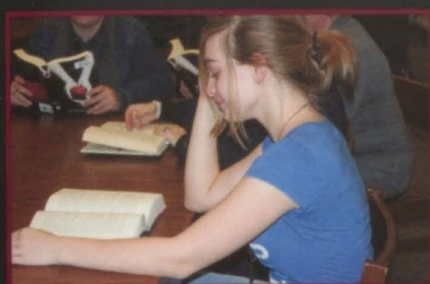

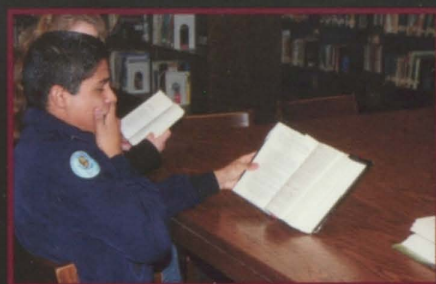

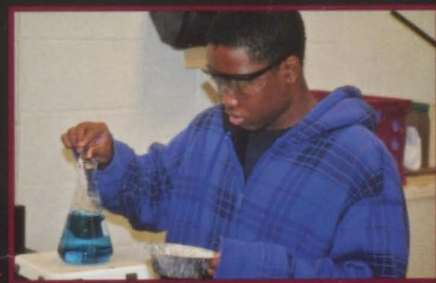

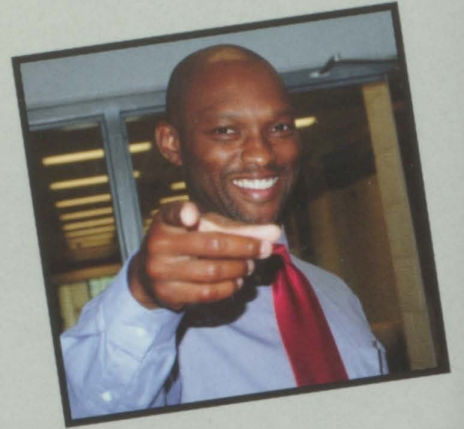

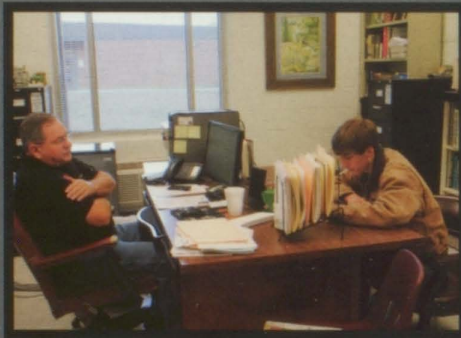

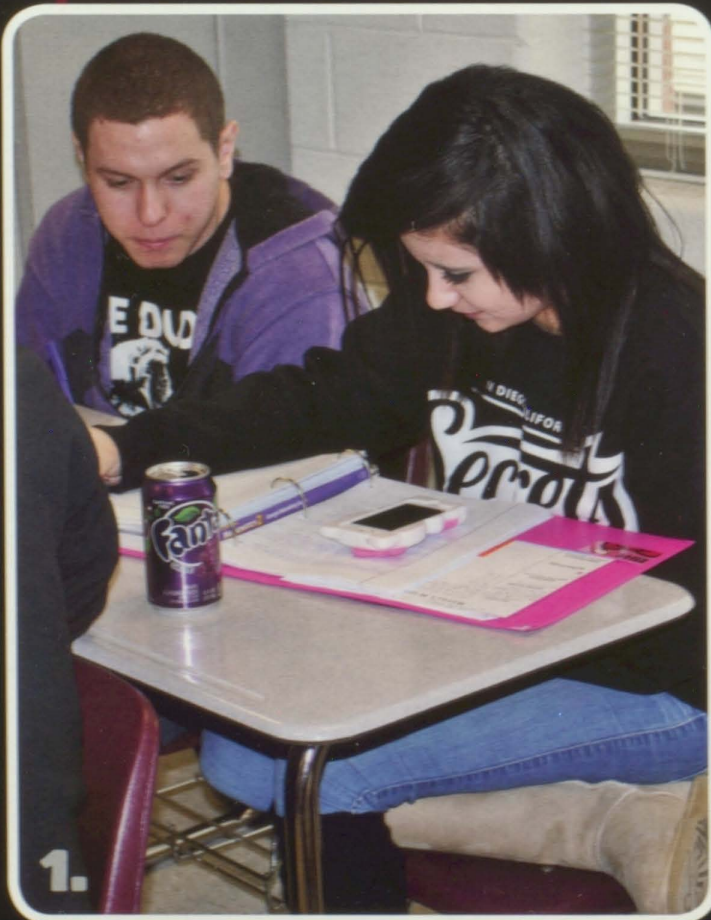


Bring Your Own Technology
