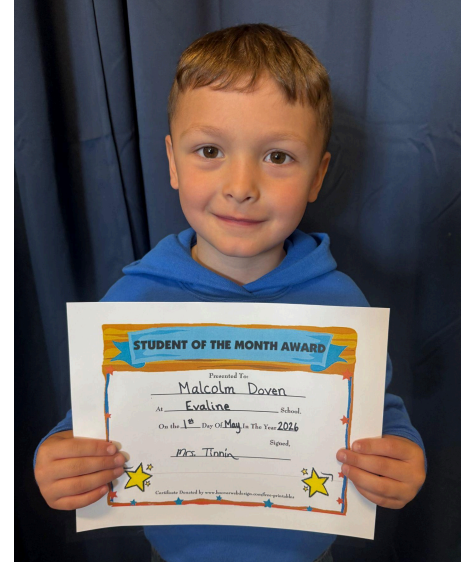


Historical Bike Ride

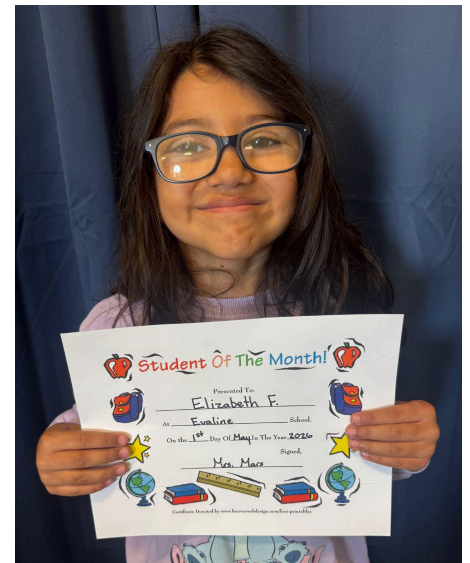
TTK - 2nd Grade

TK and Kindergarten

This week, kindergarten students continued learning about the silent "e" in words such as *game, same, hike, and kite*. They also worked collaboratively on an animal research project, exploring animals such as tigers, blue whales, and sharks. Students were especially excited to choose an animal of their own to research independently. When they are done they will share the facts they learned with the class.

TK students are learning about farm habitats and the animals that live there. They are also practicing sound-letter recognition for the letters M, A, T, D, O, C, G, I, E, B, Y, N, R, F, H, and J, as well as identifying and practicing the letters in their own names.

In math, kindergarten students continued learning to compare the length, height, and weight of different objects. TK students are continuing to practice writing the numbers 1-5 and solving simple math problems with numbers up to five. Their current focus is representing numbers using numerals and math symbols rather than drawings or pictures.
