Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the last Sunday of the Church year, and fittingly so (this feast was celebrated earlier in the pre-Vatican II calendar).

As we end our year, we are reminded that Christ is our eternal King – that He will gather all to Himself and submit it to the Father. It is a reminder that we need to allow Him to be King of our hearts and lives.

Next week we will begin Advent. This year, we have the shortest Advent possible – three weeks and a day! In this week before, I would encourage us to prepare for it. Consider a family Advent Wreath – it does not have to be fancy or expensive – and even just having four candles in a circle, lighting another candle each week.

There are a lot of sources for Advent prayer – Magnificat, Word Among Us, and Word on Fire are three of my favorites to recommend. Consider a Jesse Tree – adding one of Jesus' ancestors (or the couple such as Adam and Eve) every day and contemplating their significance in the story of salvation. There are lots of sites that would have instructions for this.

Last, ask the Blessed Mother for her presence as you prepare to welcome her Son.
