### **School Responsibilities**

### The Billingsport Early Childhood Center will:

- 1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the challenging State academic standards as follows;
  - Billingsport Early Childhood Center will create a safe and conducive learning environment that fosters meaningful engagement for all students. To ensure high quality instruction, we will align the instruction with the audited curriculum, continuously collect and analyze student performance data, review teacher lessons plan, conduct both formal and informal classroom walkthroughs and provide constructive feedback. Additionally, we are committed to providing relevant and ongoing professional development opportunities for staff to enhance their skills. By implementing these measures, we aim to ensure a successful and enriching learning experience for every student at Billingsport Early Childhood center.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held;
  - District scheduled parent conferences will be held on November 15<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup> of 2024 as well as January 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of 2025. In addition, a parent/teacher conference can be scheduled directly with your child's teacher at any time during the school year.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows;

All parents will receive formal quarterly progress reports on the following dates. Quarterly report cards will also be sent home at the end of each marking period.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows;

Staff are available for parent consultation via email and school phones. The staff members can also meet with parents in-person before school, after school and during their assigned duty-free period each day. A teacher can be provided with classroom coverage to accommodate a parent's meeting availability.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows;

Throughout the school year each grade level will have activities and events that will promote and encourage parental involvement such as Donuts with Grown-ups, Ice Cream Social, Fun Day, and Field Trips. Parents will be notified about these events by their child's classroom teacher. They will also be encouraged to volunteer and support these activities.

### **Parent Responsibilities**

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Monitor attendance.
- Ensure homework is completed when assigned.
- Monitor the amount of television watched.
- Serve on advisory groups, such as being the Title 1 parent representative on the School Improvement Team, School Safety Team, District Advisory Council and Volunteer in classroom.
- Being an active participant in decisions about my child's education.
- Stay informed about your child's education and communication with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or district and respond as appropriate.
- Accentuating the positive events at school and help my child resolve issues of concern and conflict.
- Reading to and listening to my child read daily as a way of building a lifelong interest and joy of reading.
- Seeing that my child gets adequate rest and is in school on time with a positive outlook
- Attending conferences to discuss my child's progress and attending events which. showcase my child's work and learning experiences.
- Providing and maintaining accurate information on my child's records for contact.

### **Student Responsibilities**

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the State's high standards. Specifically, we will:

- Attend the after-school tutoring program when necessary.
- Read at least 15 minutes a day outside of school.
- Give my parents/guardians all notices and information from my teacher and school.
- Allowing the teacher to teach and everyone in class to learn.
- Completing my work on time and accurately
- Keeping my hands, feet, objects, and comments to myself
- Respecting others and their property

### **Additional Required School Responsibilities**

The Billingsport Early Childhood Center will:

- 1. Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parent and family engagement policy, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
- 2. Involve parents in the joint development of any school-wide program plan, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
- 3. Hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements, and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs.
