District Academic Goals

- ➤ In 2023-24, students taking the Milestones ELA assessments will meet or exceed the 3% achievement improvement targets.

To improve literacy skills in all grade levels.

The number of students meeting/exceeding Acadience benchmark targets (composite scores) in Grades K-2 will increase by at least 3% from Fall to Spring administrations. In Grades 3-5 the number of students meeting or exceeding benchmark for Oral Reading Fluency will increase by at least 3%. School wide, at least 50% of students will meet or exceed their projected RIT score on NWEA MAP reading test and/or students taking the Milestones ELA assessment will show a 3% improvement in the areas of developing, proficient, and distinguished from the 22-23 SY.

To more effectively meet the needs of the whole child - including students' physical, emotional, social, and educational needs.

WFES will create a culture that promotes the social emotional well-being of both students and staff which will be reflected by an increase in student and staff attendance and a decrease in classroom discipline referrals.

- ✓ Teachers will receive ongoing professional learning that targets direct literacy instruction and interventions that engage and motivate all students.

To more effectively meet the needs of the whole child, we will:

- ✓ We use research based strategies to support, encourage, and reward positive behavior.
- Teach students and families why attendance is important to student success and about chronic absenteeism.
- ✓ School wide implementation of a social/emotional learning curriculum
