Absences and Makeup Work

- If you are absent from class, YOU are responsible for getting and making up any missing work
 - The school's policy on makeup work will be observed. As stated in the student handbook, the policy is as follows:

- Late work will be accepted. The **maximum** grade on any late assignment, written or online, will be 70%.
- Work submitted online will be considered late if it was edited or submitted after the due date.

Additional Policies
