7<sup>th</sup> Grade

A One Pager Book Report is designed to let you show and tell about the book you have read in a way that is different than the standard Book Report. A One Pager Book Report is creative and unique. Use artwork and color for your pictures and text.

You may write in full sentences, paragraphs, or bullet points to tell about your book. Use colorful illustrations to show your understanding in a variety of ways.

## Directions:

Use this guide to help you fill in the spaces on your One Pager Book Report.

- Title/Author- Write/draw the title and author of the novel.
- Main Character- Describe and draw the main character.
- Supporting Character- Describe a character that was not the main character, but was important in the story.
- Setting- Describe and draw the setting. (when/where the story takes place)
- Connection- Describe/draw a connection you made to the text.
- Opinion- Describe/draw your opinion of the novel.
- Important Scene- Describe the most exciting part of the novel. Include the action that changed the main character.
- Vocabulary- Choose 2-3 words from the book that were difficult for you or may be difficult for younger students. Write and define them with words or pictures.
- Theme- Write the theme of the novel. The theme is the message or moral the author wanted you to learn from the story.
