Fingerplay

Snowflakes, Snowflakes Falling Down

Snowflakes, Snowflakes falling down (wiggle fingers in the air)

Falling, falling to the ground (wiggle fingers from the air to the ground)

Can you catch them on your nose? (wiggle fingers to touch your nose)

Will they fall and touch your toes? (wiggle fingers to touch toes)

Snowflakes, snowflakes, falling down falling, falling to the ground.

(repeat movements)

Suggested Winter Writing Activity

Materials:

Paper/Journal

Crayons, pencils, color pencils, or markers

Directions:

We have read several books about winter, snow, and snow days. Draw a picture of what you and your family would do on a snow day. (Examples: build a snow man, have a snowball fight, watch movies and drink hot chocolate, take a nap) The children may use their imagination and draw whatever they want.

Have them practice writing the letter "S" for "snow".

You can also have them write a word to go along with what they are doing in the picture.

Gross Motor Activity: Use sidewalk chalk to draw swirling lines or paw prints and follow the pattern.
